Legislators sleep in boarding houses during “The Session.” They walk across the grounds to and from the State House like professors at a courtly red-brick college, living amid columned Colonial-era buildings of great authority.

On the Monday morning before the 2014 session opened, a soft rain fell on the cobblestones of Annapolis. Until about 9:30, politicians hurried to “breakfasts” where lobbyists pitched causes. Mere hours away, a weather front loomed, a plunge to near zero imminent. It seemed a metaphor for fortunes in Annapolis, the change, the suddenness.

The rain drove everyone inside, except for two of the most powerful men in Annapolis, who appeared, absent entourage, a half-hour apart, solitary figures at the top of their political careers, at the top of the legislative hierarchy.

First to appear, alone in the rain on the grass below the State House, walked Speaker of the House Michael Busch, an unlikely hero to the horse business after years of being painted as an impediment to the implementation of slots. Unbeknownst to many Marylanders, Busch was the mediator of talks between industry stakeholders in the summer of 2013 that resulted in an agreement on the distribution of Maryland-bred awards, fueling a rebirth of Maryland’s horse business.

Twice, in the out-of-session quiet in the chambers of the State House, Busch presided over a stalemate of how to program slots revenue for the greatest impact. The formula had to be comparable to that of surrounding states, in order for Maryland to compete for horses. A democratic distribution resulted.

Busch fulfilled the role of a coach. This morning, he wore a baseball hat against the rain. From a distance, on the field of grass in

front of the State House, he looked like he had just guided a team to victory.

What were the odds that the President of the Senate would also emerge on the empty lawn in the rain minutes later? Under an umbrella, Mike Miller clutched a soda can and a Pennsylvania-published horse newspaper with headlines that read: “Raids on breeding fund take toll on Pennsylvania stallions” and “Maryland poised to regain breeding primacy.”

When Miller speaks of the horse business, it’s as though he knew it from Colonial days in Annapolis. Who there doesn’t know that George Washington kept a diary of his visits?

Oct. 5, 1772

“Reached Annapolis. Dined at the Coffee House with the Jockey Club and lodged at the Govrs. . .”

Washington’s ledger records his wagers. Horse racing goes back a ways in Maryland.

Miller knows how precious the game is to the state, that the farms are vital, to grow local horses to race at local tracks. He knows that the Maryland Jockey Club just increased the Preakness purse by 50 percent for 2014. He knows that a dozen new stallions have arrived in the state. He loves the slogan “The Colts Are Back.” He understands that fillies are following the colts, and the mare population is on the rise. He is excited that farms are being preserved, that another generation is coming of age into a renaissance of racing and breeding. He could teach History but is most interested in Current Events.

“We’ve got it going now,” he says with a smile to anyone who asks about the horse business. “Let’s keep it going.”

There’s a romance to Annapolis in the rain, so cinematic, so collegial, so redolent of history and tradition. It doesn’t run on romance, though. It runs on money. That’s why

politicians were hurrying to breakfasts. They had one day left before the session started. Last day for campaign contributions, political donations, before the stream would be turned off for 90 days.

That's plenty of time for every horseperson who receives a bonus check to appreciate where the money comes from: Annapolis.

Owners of Maryland-breds, as of the first day of 2014, are being rewarded for finishing second and third, in addition to the customary first-place award, all factored at 17.5 percent. In 2015, Owners' Awards rise to 30 percent, same as breeders, as new slot revenue fuels the Purse Dedication Account.

## Coulda, Woulda, Shoulda been Maryland-bred Horse of the Year

The task isn't always easy when voting for year-end awards, including Maryland-bred champions. Often a deserving candidate is left high and dry, especially when choosing the top honor of Horse of the Year.

Over the past 50 years of Maryland-bred champions, many a top-notch horse has missed the preeminent award. A few weren't even honored in their divisions. Associate editor Cindy Deubler looked over the list of top Maryland-bred runners since the championships were first handed out in 1963, and picked her top 10 omissions—runners deserving of the title of Horse of the Year, but left empty handed.

### 1 Awad (1993, 1995-97)

The son of Caveat is the second-richest Maryland-bred in history with \$3,270,818, a four-time Maryland-bred champion turf horse (1993, 1995-97), an 11-time stakes winner who won four Grade 1 races, and



still holds course records at Saratoga (1½ miles in 2:23.20, set Aug. 9, 1997, in the Sword Dancer Invitational Handicap-G1) and Arlington Park (1¼ miles in 1:58.69, set Aug. 27, 1995, in the Arlington Million Stakes-G1). Awad's timing was perhaps the worst of any Maryland-bred in history, as his best years came against the campaigns of Cigar (1995

and 1996) and Smoke Glacken (1997). When a horse wins \$1 million in a season (1995) and is not named Horse of the Year, it's unprecedented. In 1993, his 3-year-old season in which he won the Grade 1 Secretariat Stakes, Awad wasn't up against Eclipse Award winners, but still couldn't pass Valley Crossing for Horse of the Year.

### 2 Little Bold John (1987-'89)

A horse wins 25 stakes over the course of his career and retires as the third-richest Maryland-bred in history, earning \$1,956,405 (he now ranks seventh)—it would appear he'd be a lock to be awarded the state's highest honor. But Little Bold John failed to earn a divisional title in 1987 for a year with eight stakes wins, and lost out as Horse of the Year during his Maryland-bred championship seasons as older male in 1988 and 1989. *Horse of the year: Broad Brush (1987), Deputy Governor (1988), Safely Kept (1989)*

### 3 Deputed Testamony (1983)

Taking the Preakness Stakes-G1 put Deputed Testamony on a higher level, as he was voted state-bred champion 3-year-old male over two other classic winners, but he couldn't overtake the Eclipse Award-winning 2-year-old. *Horse of the year: Devil's Bag*



## 4 Shareef Dancer (1983)

He won the Irish Sweeps Derby-G1 and was named champion 3-year-old in England and Ireland in 1983, but as a member of one of Maryland's best 3-year-old crops in history, Shareef Dancer didn't win the divisional title, although he did take home the trophy as Maryland-bred champion turf runner. *Horse of the year: Devil's Bag*

## 5 Smart Angle and Smarten (1979)

The half-siblings had stellar seasons in 1979, with Smart Angle earning the Eclipse Award as champion 2-year-old filly, as well as the divisional title among Maryland-breds, and Smarten taking the Maryland-bred trophy for his 3-year-old campaign. Smart Angle won four Grade 1 stakes, while Smarten captured six stakes, including four derbies. Combined they earned \$998,150 and won a dozen stakes that year. *Horse of the year: Star de Naskra*

## 6 Heavenly Cause (1980, 1981)

Winner of the Eclipse Award as top 2-year-old filly of 1980, the big gray was a Maryland-bred champion at 2 and 3 (1980, 1981). She captured seven stakes, five Grade 1s. In 1981, her wins included the Grade 1 Kentucky Oaks, Acorn and Fantasy Stakes. *Horse of the year: Dave's Friend (1980), Jameela (1981)*

## 7 Life's Illusion (1975)

The first filly to win a national championship as top steeplechaser when awarded the Eclipse in 1975, the stellar mare was named Maryland-bred champion steeplechaser three straight years (1975-'77). *Horse of the year: Christopher R. (1975)*

## 8 Caveat (1983)

Winner of the 1983 Belmont Stakes-G1, Caveat was one of three Maryland-bred

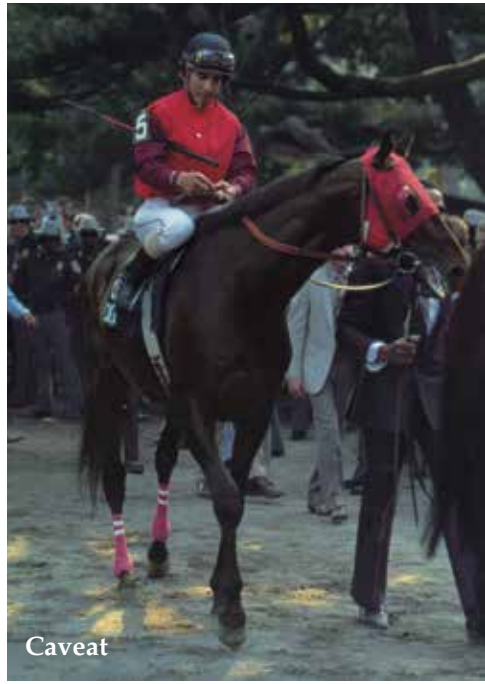

classic winners that year, in a class which also included two Eclipse Award winners. He missed out on the divisional title to Preakness Stakes-G1 winner Deputed Testamony. *Horse of the year: Devil's Bag*

### 9 **Secreto (1984)**

The son of Northern Dancer won two of three starts at 3, including an epic duel in the Epsom Derby-G1 with another Maryland-bred son of Northern Dancer, El Gran Senor. He also finished third in that year's Irish Two Thousand Guineas-G1. By year's end, he was overshadowed by El Gran Senor, who took the divisional and turf titles and Horse of the Year.

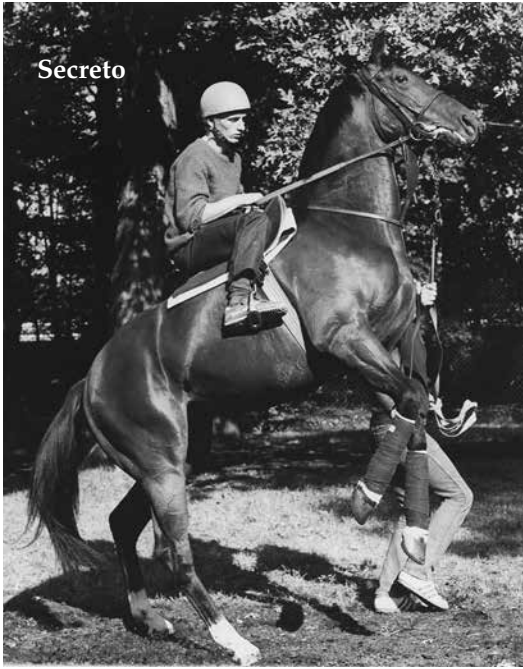
### 10 **Heartlight No. One (1983)**

The Eclipse Award-winning 3-year-old filly of 1983, the daughter of Rock Talk also easily took the title of Maryland-bred champion that year after winning five of seven starts, two Grade 1s. *Horse of the year: Devil's Bag*



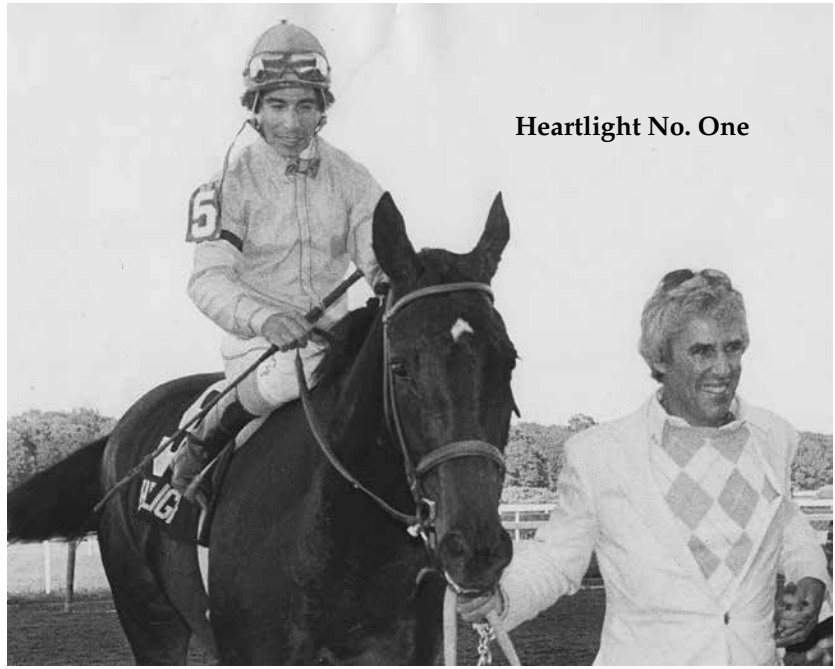

## MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

### Broad Rule repeats in Fire Plug Stakes

Fitzhugh LLC's homebred Broad Rule ran down the speed and captured the \$100,000 Fire Plug Stakes for the second year in a row Jan. 4 at Laurel Park.

Just as in 2013 (when sent off at 16-1), Broad Rule was

overlooked in the wagering and paid \$26.80. The late run was good enough to stave off Service for Ten by three-quarters of a length in 1:11.49.

The 6-year-old son of Dixie Union won for the seventh time in 34 starts, for earnings of \$384,215. He is one of nine stakes horses from 13 foals

produced by 2001 Maryland Broodmare of the Year Illeria (by Stop the Music), herself a graded stakes winner of \$392,691. Her other stakes horses include Grade 1 win-

ner and millionaire Include, graded stakes winner Magic Broad, five-time stakes winner and \$645,330-earner Encaustic, and stakes winner Magical Broad.

When longtime Maryland breeder/owner Janet Wayson made the decision to get out of racing in 2012, her son Konrad Wayson offered to take all her horses in training, as well as the yearlings and weanlings. One of the yearlings was Joint Custody, a son

of Outflanker who blossomed to become one of the best juveniles in training in Maryland in 2013. The gray/roan gelding recorded his second stakes win of the year by taking the \$100,000 Maryland Juvenile Championship Dec. 28.

Joint Custody overcame a stumbling start and survived a heated duel down the backstretch before galloping home by 5½ lengths over Fran's Buckaroo as the 3-10 favorite in the field of six Maryland-breds. He completed the 7-furlong distance in 1:25.19.

Trainer Jerry Robb orchestrated a campaign for Joint Custody which resulted in four wins and a second from six starts. Robb also guided the career of Joint Custody's dam Paying Off, a daughter of Malibu Moon who hit the board in 14 of 18 starts for Konrad's late father, Morgan Wayson. When Paying Off

won the Twixt Stakes at Laurel Park in 2007, it was Robb's 100th career stakes win.

Morgan Wayson had purchased Paying Off as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling sale in 2005 for \$14,000. She went on to earn \$192,380 over two seasons.

The Waysons bought their first racehorse in the early 1970s, and ran a successful stable over the decades, much because of their connection with Thirty Eight Paces, whom they owned in a partnership which included

Janet's cousin King T. Leatherybury. A number of the couple's best runners were by Thirty Eight Paces, including 1987 Maryland-bred champion 2-year-old filly Thirty Eight Go Go and graded stakes winner Lightning Paces. They also had success with offspring of Outflanker, sending out his son Apple Special (a \$15,000 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling purchase) to win the Maryland Juvenile Championship in 2007.

Following Morgan's death in November 2008, Janet con-



tinued to run the operation from her West River farm, and bred Paying Off to Outflanker in 2010 and 2011. Konrad also owns Joint Custody's 2-year-old full brother, Awol.

Paying Off wasn't bred in 2012, and was sold privately last spring, months before Joint Custody's first start.

"Mom and I didn't want to breed them so we sold her," said Konrad.

Janet Wayson has since moved to Florida, and Konrad resides on the family farm in Maryland, a portion of which is Leatherbury's former Craftwell Farm, which the Waysons bought about 10

years ago. Among the equine residents are stakes-producing mare Classy Choice, who is no longer in production, and retired multiple stakes winner Great Love.

Konrad has had other runners over the years, but Joint Custody is the first stakes winner to carry his blue and

gray silks. In addition to Joint Custody, his current stable counts two 2-year-olds, another 3-year-old and an older horse. And what's one thing about the business he learned from his father? "Keep playing the game—don't give up on it."
