A Few Good Men

A bunch of rich fellows at a dinner in Saratoga in 1868 were in high spirits when they concocted an idea to stimulate racing in Maryland. Whether it was the wine, or the healing scars of the Civil War, a dinner party promise helped Pimlico Race Course get started.

"We, the subscribers, agree to run a sweepstakes at the Baltimore fall meeting of 1870... to be run over a course to be built at Baltimore, Maryland."

Anticipating remorse, or alcohol-induced amnesia, they named the sweepstakes to summon the memory of their collegial evening: The Dinner Party Stakes. For 3-year-olds.

The prospective contestants were still yearlings. Among the 30 pedigrees submitted as nominations on Oct. 10, 1868, was Mr. Milton H. Sanford's bay colt by the great Kentucky sire Lexington. Mr. Sanford named the colt Preakness, and he won the inaugural Dinner Party Stakes at newly opened Pimlico in 1870.

Fast-forward 144 years. On Wednesday, April 30, 2014, five inches of rain fell on Pimlico. Nearby in midtown, parked cars tumbled down a collapsed retaining wall onto railroad tracks. An entire Baltimore city block fell to the force of rainwater. But the venerable racing surface at Pimlico was labeled "Fast" on Thursday, May 1, to the mar-

vel of a man familiar with soil and rain.

Earl "Buddy" Hance is Maryland's Secretary of Agriculture. He grew up in the tobacco fields of southern Maryland. He rotates his attention like a farmer rotates crops. He is seated in Pimlico's dining room, the thickness of glass away from the dirt track, the maintenance of which he clearly admires.

"How are things on the horse farms of Maryland?" is the question on his mind.

Bill Boniface puts down his fork. He trained Preakness winner Deputed Testamony. He goes to bed at 7:30 some nights, rises at 4:30 all mornings.

"Foals everywhere this spring, Buddy," says Boniface. "A neighbor called me the other night, asked for help foaling. I was asleep, but I got up, and we got that baby's leg down, and it came right out."

Hance knows that horse farming is relevant again in Maryland, like it was in the 1960s, when the Maryland Fund began. He knows what happens when a form of agriculture cashes out: Developers cash in. The tobacco barns of Hance's youth quietly collapse like those cars onto that railroad track, slowly disappearing, erosion at work.

Cracks precede a collapse. Cracks of distress tore open every horse farm in this state. An enlightened Maryland Racing Commission answered the 911 call in 2013, responding to an 80% loss of inventory over the preceding decade. The Commission reprogrammed slots revenue to stimulate agriculture and racing in Maryland. Now, the colts are back, as the industry slogan proudly proclaims.

In the catacombs of the Pimlico clubhouse, phones ring off the hook for Preakness tickets. Preakness Sales Associate Ty Ehlis calmly crosses out open sections of the seating chart. He says:

"Until the Racing Commission got involved and worked out the 10-Year-Deal, we didn't know if we could buy our kids any Christmas presents. We didn't know if we'd have a job." A chorus of "amens" breaks out in the ticket control room.

History bears out racing's ebbs and flows. For two decades after the first Dinner Party Stakes, Pimlico flourished. But competitive meetings sprung up in New Jersey and New York, and racing ceased at Pimlico in the 1890s. In 1904, by emphasizing short race meetings, Pimlico reopened. When New York tracks were shuttered by anti-

gambling forces in 1911-12, Pimlico received exiled racing stables. Legalized betting followed, and the Maryland Jockey Club prospered by the pari-mutuel system. Horse owners followed the money. The Preakness became a classic.

So long as Pimlico runs a race meet, the Preakness will anchor Maryland racing. Every road across the land leads to Pimlico on the third Saturday in May.

Red paint accents the old grandstand, the patrol judge towers, the balcony where the jockeys stand in their sleeveless T's in the spring air, awaiting the next ride around the splendid old track.

Bear in mind, this immutable scene started almost a century-and-a-half ago. In Racing in America 1866-1921,

turf historian Walter Vosburgh wrote: "Despite stormy weather, the inaugural meeting was a decided success. A heavy rainstorm had left the track very deep and muddy, but the public response was encouraging."

The grandstand roof leaks in a few places at Pimlico. Well, maybe that's understandable. This past decade has been hard on Maryland racing. Be a sport. Bring an umbrella. Don't complain.

When you turn East on Winner Avenue, go back a quarter mile and 144 years, and you are there. Here's a tip. Bet Preakness in the Dinner Party. Friendly spirits, perhaps in their cups, were overheard just the other day.

Purely Hot makes grade at Woodbine

The remarkable career of Purely Hot rose to a new level when in the second start of her 6-year-old season she reeled in the early leaders and drew off to capture Woodbine's \$150,000 Whimsical Stakes-G3 April 26 by 3½ lengths. In recording her first graded victory, Purely Hot completed 6 furlongs in 1:09.89 over the synthetic track with Chantal Sutherland Kruse aboard.

Purely Hot races for Unlimited Equine and is trained by Tevis McCauley. For most

of last year she competed in the name of Tuozzo Racing for trainer Nick Caruso, going from \$4,000 claimer to stakes winner to finishing a dazzling second behind twotime champion female sprinter Groupie Doll in the Grade 2 Presque Isle Downs Masters Stakes.

Three times in the winter of 2013 Purely Hot was claimed at Penn National, starting the year for a \$4,000 tag. When Caruso got the daughter of Pure Prize back for \$10,000 in March, he sent her out in starter-allowance company, then took a swing

at stakes competition. In her stakes debut last June in the \$100,000 Satin and Lace at Presque Isle Downs, she won by 5 lengths. Spending the summer at Presque Isle, she crossed the finish line first five consecutive times, winning each by daylight (she was later disqualified from purse money for a medication positive in the fifth win).

Stakes competition once again beckoned, and she tackled Groupie Doll in the track's signature event. Battling through the stretch, Purely Hot grudgingly gave way to finish 11/2 lengths back while giving Groupie Doll three pounds. Following a fourth in the Grade 2 Thoroughbred Club of America Stakes at Keeneland, Purely Hot was offered at Fasig-Tipton's select November mixed sale in Kentucky, where she sold as a racing or broodmare prospect for \$225,000.

The Woodbine win increased her earnings to \$409,525 from 29 starts, with 12 wins, three seconds and four thirds. Sixteen starts

have been on the turf or synthetic tracks, where she has hit the board 11 times.

Purely Hot is the second foal for Wood Not, a daughter of Kissin Kris and the Maryland-bred top-notch racemare Wood So. Wood Not was a three-time winner of \$74,200; her dam was a four-time stakes winner of \$530,155, with three of her stakes wins coming in graded company, topped by the 1992 Barbara Fritchie Handicap-G2. The daughter of Baederwood and the Bold Monarch mare Impudence produced stakes winners Allwood and Iwoodificould.

Dr. and Mrs. A. Leonard Pineau claimed Wood Not late in her career for \$14,000 at Timonium in 2005 and have bred five foals out of her, including current 3-year-old T Sizzle, Purely Hot's full-brother who was second in his debut on May 2.

The mare's most recent foal, a colt by Songandaprayer, was sold as a weanling last November at Keeneland for \$40,000.

Sagamore Farm siblings shine in April stakes

Sagamore Farm enjoyed a banner week in mid-April as Maryland-bred half-siblings Daring Dancer and Hamp won stakes two days apart.

The double started at Keeneland as 3-year-old filly Daring Dancer improved to 3-for-3 in her career with a triumph in the \$100,000 Appalachian Stakes-G3 for trainer Graham Motion. The daughter of Empire Maker was making her stakes debut and made it look easy with a late move to the front when clear to win by 21/2 lengths. Alan Garcia rode the winner, whose career began with a maiden score at Laurel Park last September. At Keeneland, Daring Dancer sat just off the pace and moved into contention on the far turn. She found a seam past the quarter pole and outkicked Sweet Acclaim (Ire) and favorite Recepta late.

Two days later, Daring Dancer's big brother Hamp answered the challenge with a gutsy, late-running win in the \$100,000 Henry S. Clark Stakes at Pimlico. Trained for Sagamore by Ignacio Correas IV, Hamp charged from well back in the eight-horse field to catch Roadhog at the wire and win by a head. It was the winner's fourth victory in 16 starts, and his first in stakes company. The son of Sky Mesa spent the winter in Florida, and made three starts at Gulfstream Park (all losses). Risked for a \$62,500 tag in mid-March, one start before the stakes win, Hamp finished a late-running third going 11/16 miles at Gulfstream. The loss set up the Clark score, where Hamp again relaxed early before making a run.

Two-time Maryland Million winner Roadhog, in his 2014 debut, was game in de-

feat. He fought off an inside challenge from Nutello, but could not withstand Hamp's stretch power. Correas was proud of his new stakes winner.

"He had very bad luck in the first stakes he ran in at Saratoga last year," said the trainer. "It was a terrible trip. He might have won or been second. He tries hard and was always finding excuses. I was watching this race and at three-eighths [pole], I thought he was going to win. Then he had to go six wide. It wasn't an easy race."

Hamp is more than a racehorse around the Sagamore barn of owner Kevin Plank, the founder and CEO of Under Armour. First, the horse is named for Bill "Hamp" Hampton Jr., the former senior director of pro leagues at Under Armour who died in 2011 at age 51. Second, Hamp the horse is about as nice as racehorses get.

"If you asked for a horse with a nice personality to be around, that's him," said Correas. "He has everything, on the track, in the stall, outside, everywhere, he is like a pet. Everybody likes him."

The Sagamore homebreds are out of Vienna Affair (GB), a Red Ransom mare purchased for \$380,000 at Keeneland November in 2009. The half-sister to European stakes winners Crowded House and On Reflection was carrying Hamp at the time and delivered Daring Dancer in 2011. Sagamore also

has a 2-year-old filly by Malibu Moon out of Vienna Affair named Future Show. The mare did not have a foal in 2013, but delivered a Kitten's Joy filly this year only to be felled by complications and a bout with laminitis. She was euthanized, but the filly is following in the hoofprints of her stakes-winning siblings at Sagamore.

"All that family is very nice," said Correas. "The baby with the nurse mare is probably the most good looking of all of them. She is outstanding, athletic and she is going to be big compared to Daring Dancer. We are going to miss that mare, but at least we have plenty of that family."



Appearing totally outclassed, Hickory Ridge Farm's homebred Aunt Ellen, seeking her first win in her 11th career start, went postward for the \$75,000 Twixt Stakes at 11/16 miles for Maryland-bred 3-year-old fillies April 5 as the longest shot on board at 18-1. Running to her odds early, the gray daughter of Pure Prize found a new gear late and flew down the stretch to collar favorite Steady N Love in the final strides and win by a head.

Aunt Ellen's previous best finish was a second in her second career start in July 2013 while in for a \$30,000 tag. In her other nine starts, she was never closer than 5 lengths, that being her previous effort on March 14 at Laurel Park for a claiming price of \$35,000. Trainer Ferris Allen noted after her stakes win, "Unfortunately she was training better than racing. She would either move too early or make some other kind of mistake in previous races."

The first foal out the Maria's Mon mare Princess Hillary, Aunt Ellen increased her earnings to \$73,035. Her dam, a half-sister to graded stakes-winning sprinter and \$578,646-earner Starforaday, has a 2-year-old filly by Bernstein named Wyandot and produced a filly in 2013 by Old Fashioned. Princess Hillary was bred back to Old Fashioned for 2014.

Two days after being honored at the Maryland Horse Breeders Association's awards dinner for his record third title as Horse of the Year, Ben's Cat made his 8-year-old debut in the Mister Diz Stakes at Pimlico April 5. He dominated in the 5-furlong turf test, cruising home by 1% lengths over a course rated good while recording his fifth win in the Maryland-bred stakes.

With the score, King T. Leatherbury's homebred got his 20th stakes victory, and boosted his record to 25 wins from 38 starts, for earnings of \$1,907,790. He is eighth on the all-time Maryland-bred money winner's list, less than \$50,000 behind Little Bold John, who leads all Maryland-bred runners (on

the flat) by number of stakes wins, with 25.

Racing in the colors of her breeder Fred Lewis' Lewis Family Racing Stable, Celtic Katie accelerated down the Pimlico stretch to win the \$75,000 Geisha Stakes for Maryland-bred fillies and mares by 5¼ widening lengths April 26. It was the first stakes win for the 5-year-old mare, who earlier this year placed in Laurel's Nellie Morse and Conniver.

Sent off as fourth choice in the field of five, Celtic Katie paid \$12 for the win in the 11/16-mile Geisha. Third or better in 11 of her 21 career starts, the Chris Grove trainee recorded her fourth victory and pushed her earnings to \$198,835.

The daughter of Posse is the first foal for her dam, Katie's Love, who also became a stakes winner at 5 when taking the 2007 Shine Again Stakes at Pimlico. Three times stakes-placed (twice in the Geisha), Katie's Love retired with earnings of \$248,500.

Lewis had purchased Katie's Love as a yearling for \$60,000 at the 2003 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Sale. The Not For Love filly was a bit of a celebrity at the time, having been named champion of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association's Yearling Show earlier that summer when exhibited by her breeder Brice Ridgely-bred yearling at the show, her close relative and



class winner Declan's Moon. Also sold at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sale, Declan's Moon was purchased by Jay Em Ess Stable for \$125,000. The next year, he earned the Eclipse Award as the nation's top 2-year-old male.

Celtic Katie's second dam, the Somethingfabulous mare Fabulous Vee, produced four stakes horses, including additional stakes winner Sabovee as well as graded stakesplaced Vee Vee Star, dam of Declan's Moon. Katie's Love's second foal, Celtic Katie's year-younger full-brother Katie's Posse, placed at 2 and 3. The mare was barren the next year, and her only other foal is the current 2-year-old Lion Hearted filly Katie's Caddie.


Hall of Famer Safely Kept dies at 28

Safely Kept, an Eclipse Award winner, multiple Maryland-bred champion and Hall of Famer, died at Burleson Farm in Kentucky April 22. The pensioned broodmare was 28.

Bred by JoAnn and David Hayden, Safely Kept lived a long life but did everything quickly. She was second in her debut in 1988, then won three in a row including two stakes. Sold by the Haydens to a group headed by Barry Weisbord, for \$300,000, she won eight in a row to start her 3-year-old campaign, the only loss a second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint-G1 to Dancing Spree. Safely Kept won the Eclipse Award as champion sprinter that season.

As good as the 1989 season was, she may have been just as good in 1990, an eight-win campaign that included scores in the Genuine Risk-G2, Garden State Breeders' Cup-G3, Thoroughbred Club of America-G3, Meadowlands Breeders' Cup-G3, Maryland Million Distaff and Finger Lakes Breeders' Cup. She closed that year by claiming that elusive Breeders' Cup Sprint title, when she edged champion Dayjur (who jumped a shadow in the Belmont Park stretch).

Trained mainly by New Jersey-based Alan Goldberg (but also by Carlos Garcia early in her career), Safely Kept won 24 of 31 lifetime starts and earned \$2,194,206. She

Years later, another Dark Hollow mare was at Thornmar Farm to be bred to Horatius, but tried to kick the stallion and couldn't be bred. So the Haydens sent Safely Home, and got Safely Kept. Not exactly a "genius" breeding decision.

broodmare.

Safely Kept dazzled from the start.

"You could look at her in the field, she was the package," said JoAnn in 2011. "She was always the one you looked at. She was a big powerful horse, but never a problem on the farm. Wonderful, a sweetheart. All of the foals from that mare were the same way, wise beyond their years with a calmness about them. Tough, very smart, but not rank or pushy."

was crowned Maryland-bred Horse of the Year in 1989 and 1990 and won state-bred championships in each of her four seasons on the track. She retired to life as a broodmare and produced eight winners including stakes winners Peace Chant and Contrast.

The daughter of Horatius and the Winning Hit mare Safely Home was inducted into the National Racing Hall of Fame in 2011.

Even at 28, Safely Kept's death impacted the Haydens.

"It's a sad day at Dark Hollow Farm, but we have many, many fond memories," said David Hayden the day after she passed. "She gave us our lives."

And to think it nearly didn't happen. The Haydens are first-generation racing people and credit watching Secretariat win the Belmont Stakes with convincing them to get involved. In 1980, Ron
