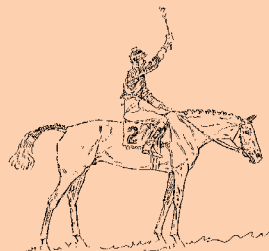

## The Art of Peb

*Famed racing cartoonist tapped to receive Heighe Award for excellence in equestrian journalism*

**P**ierre Bellocq, best known in racing circles as Peb, has been the premier equine cartoonist in the United States for 60 years. A native of France, his big break in this country came in 1954 when invited by Laurel Race Course owner John D. Schapiro to create artwork for the Washington, D.C., International. He has left his creative mark on racing ever since.

The renowned equestrian and political cartoonist has been selected to receive the fourth Robert and Anne Heighe Award for Excellence in Equestrian Journalism, which will be presented the evening of Friday, Oct. 2, at Harford Community College.

The award is given by the Hays-Heighe House, a public history site at Harford Community College. The Hays-Heighe House was the centerpiece of Robert and Anne Heighe's 225-acre Prospect Hill Farm (headquarters of their Thoroughbred breeding and racing operations) from 1921-53.

"Honoring Peb: An Evening of Art & Conversation" features the opportunity to view an exhibit of Peb's work as well as hear stories from the artist as he reflects on his life. The conversation will be facilitated by Michael H.S. Finney,



grandson of last year's award recipient, Humphrey S. Finney, and proprietor of Yoicks! in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. The

event starts at 6 p.m. in the Hays-Heighe House's galleries before moving to the Chesapeake Center Dining Room

at 7 p.m. for the award presentation and conversation.

Also that evening, Peb's design for the program cover for the 30th anniversary of the Jim McKay Maryland Million will be unveiled. His work has been featured three times on the Maryland Million program cover in the past.

Peb's first published cartoon in the U.S. appeared in the *Morning Telegraph* (sister publication of the *Daily Racing Form*) on opening day of Jamaica Racetrack in New York in 1955. His work appeared in the *Daily Racing Form* for more than 50 years.

Peb also provided editorial cartoons for *The Philadelphia Inquirer* (which at one time had the same owner as the *Daily Racing Form*) and

produced numerous cartoons illustrating the civil rights struggle and various social issues in the U.S. in the 1960s and 1970s.

The Hays-Heighe House exhibit, titled, *Peb, at a Gallop: The Art of Pierre Bellocq*, features more than 50 cartoons, with topics ranging from horse racing to politics to civil rights.

Included in the exhibit will be program covers, sketches never before published, and original artwork.

Among the horse racing highlights are his cartoons featuring the connections of Secretariat; the great racehorses Cigar (foaled in Harford County), Havre de Grace (named after the Harford County city) and Rags to

Riches (2007 Belmont winner); and drawings of Hall of Fame jockeys Angel Cordero and Gary Stevens.

Included as well will be the original study and cartoon of J. William Boniface, a Harford Countian and co-owner/trainer of 1983 Preakness winner Deputed Testamony.

Several cartoons published by *The Philadelphia Inquirer* will be on display and illustrate the civil rights struggle of the 1960s. Also included in the exhibit will be a cartoon Peb completed earlier this year in support of the French magazine *Charlie Hebdo*, after a terrorist attack on its offices.

The exhibit is curated by Maryanna Skowronski, director of the Historical Society of Harford County.

*Peb, at a Gallop: The Art of Pierre Bellocq* will be open Sept. 10 to Nov. 6. Hours are Tuesdays from 1 to 3 p.m.; Fridays from 10 a.m. to noon and first Saturdays from 10 a.m. to noon. Admission to the exhibit during those times is free.

Tickets for "Honoring Peb: An Evening of Art & Conversation" are \$30 per person and include heavy hors d'oeuvres, beer and wine. They may be purchased at [www.harford.edu/Peb](http://www.harford.edu/Peb).

## Applications due for MRMA scholarships

Applications for the Maryland Racing Media Association's 2015 scholarship program are being accepted through Sept. 11.

With the support of industry donors and organizations, MRMA has distributed approximately \$30,000 annually to scholarship recipients over the past

decade. Those interested in applying must either be backstretch employees, work on a Thoroughbred farm or with an equine vet clinic in Maryland. Submissions need to include an employer's letter of recommendation and a second reference from an individual who is a licensed or recognized member of the

The scholarships will be distributed at MRMA's annual crab feast and awards dinner, to be held Nov. 7 at Laurel Park.

MRMA will once again present its awards that evening, with longtime Northview Stallion Station co-founder and president Richard Golden to receive the organization's highest honor, the Humphrey S. Finney Award, for lifetime contributions to the Maryland horse racing industry.

Maryland Racing Commission chairman Bruce Quade has been selected to receive the Nancy Alberts Achievement Award, and new national Hall of Fame inductees trainer King Leatherbury and Xtra Heat have been named winners of the MRMA Dale Austin Newsmaker Award.

Tickets for the crab feast are \$60 apiece, or \$550 for a table of 10. A silent auction of racing memorabilia to help fund the scholarship program will also be conducted.

## Maryland-breds at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky in July

Two of the six Maryland-breds sent through the ring at the Fasig-Tipton July Sale of selected yearlings in Lexington, Ky., July 9 sold for six figures. The average price of the four sold was \$108,750, 11 percent higher than the overall average of \$97,585 for the sale.

Top price of the four was an Into Mischief filly purchased for \$160,000 by Ben McElroy, agent. Bred by Classic Thoroughbred 25 and consigned by CandyLand, the filly is the first foal out of the unraced Not For Love mare Apple Pie Baby, a three-quarter sister to stakes winner

Five Star Dream. The filly's first two dams are CandyLand Farm homebreds, her second dam the stakes winner Time to Dream.

Bringing a final bid of \$120,000 from Hall Family Trust was a Curlin colt out of four-time stakes winner and Maryland-bred champion Richetta from the consignment of Allied Bloodstock. Bred by Huckleberry Farm LLC, the bay is a half-brother to multiple stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Concealed Identity. The family

includes champion Heavenly Cause and Grade 1-winning millionaire Bounding Basque.

## Summer Reading

What if families in the horse business each had a book that traced their history with horses? Would the next generation read how it all got started, where it led? Could it help them make career choices? Could they read between the lines?

Think of an anthology of family lore, on a wide oak table, in a sitting room with windows looking out over a pasture. Think of summer reading, oral history recorded, one-part genealogy, one-part story. Call it: The Best American Horse Stories of the Century, for any particular family.

*The Foreword*, a poem by Richard Hooker:

*...That posterity may know  
We have  
Not loosely through silence  
Permitted things to pass  
Away as in a dream.*

The Introduction: An ocean of doubt surrounds every parent who contemplates their children following them into the horse business. A brave little flotilla. A ship of fools, outsiders would say, since why else would only a handful of family farms remain in Maryland, in Kentucky, for that matter? Horse farms have gone big-corporate.

The horse business married the casino business, for better

or worse, for richer or poorer. That's the conflict, the plot. How long will the marriage last?

The Stories: For the five children of majority on this particular farm, here follow decade-by-decade the threads of short stories, their narrative arc, their rising action, their separate conflicts.

1900-10: Horse racing is shut down in New York, which causes it to flourish in Maryland. August Belmont takes the French-born son of his vintner and puts him through Columbia. That's your great-grandfather.

1910-20: Saratoga sales. Buy that red colt, he tells Riddle. Mrs. Belmont named him Man o' War, for the Major, away in Spain, he says. He told me to sell the entire crop, to help the war effort, he tells Riddle, who never forgets the immortal advice, and late in life, gives your great-grandfather a season to the greatest horse ever.

1920-30: Maj. Belmont dies. The day before the Derby, trains run from Louisville to Lexington for the estate sale, and 3,000 folks show up. He is the organizer of the auction, and buys Man o' War's sire, Fair Play, for Joseph Widener, for \$100,000.

1930-40: "My family loves the new farm, even this winter, when we had no heat for four days," he writes about his new country life. Three sons, first-generation Americans, play ice hockey, learn to shoot, read the papers about the fall of France, about the bombing of Britain. Their lives turn serious.

1940-50: One son near Normandy, two in the Remount, all three away at the war. Post-war, sons home, he writes: "Took Lady Glory to Roebbling's farm in Jersey, bred to Case Ace." He likes the bold move in a card game. Read between the lines to who he is. He names the filly: Raise You.

1950-60: He dies on Christmas Day, in this house. Can you imagine what a sad day? Who could even think of opening a present on such a day? Three sons look around the room at each other. What now? What else? Let's carry on.

1960-70: Raise a Native is born, out of Raise You. Saggy stands in stud barn. His son Carry Back wins Derby and Preakness, loses Belmont to a son of Correspondent, also in the stud barn. A Triple Crown for the home sires. Without respect, Larry MacPhail steals Saggy for Glenangus, can't

book him, and the horse comes back. Lesson there: Control.

1970-80: Stallions getting old. So are your grandfather and great-uncle. They are drowning under the weight of colleges and cocktails. Back-hoes arrive, perc tests conducted. Pressure to develop. Why don't you sell off your side? Accusations fly. Lesson there: Always keep fresh blood in the stud barn, and watch yourselves.

1980-90: Hallelujah! Hallelujah! They're going to meetings. One day at a time is how you save a farm.

1990-2000: Pull out enough foals every spring, and you might have your hands on the ankles of another Cigar—the incredible, unbeatable, incomparable Cigar.

2000-10: I know he only won one race, but just look at him! Here's a lesson: Raise a Native and Hail to Reason raced at 2, bred at 3. He's 3 to start the new century. Malibu Moon is rising.

2010-15: Half-a-decade in, your kids are out of school. The County cares little for farmland, a lot for taxes. They'll widen the old road, and stop lights could stop everything. Find your destiny. If it includes horse farming, new chapters will be written.

The missing element of short stories in the horse business is that there is no neat resolution. Cigar is sterile, for instance. The lesson is—there is no lesson. Use your head. Follow your heart. We've got your back.

## MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

### Kiss to Remember scores easily in Monroe Stakes

Miller Racing's Kiss to Remember proved much the best with a 6 $\frac{3}{4}$ -length victory in the \$75,000 Monroe Handicap at Gulfstream Park July 25. Running to her 2-5 odds, the 4-year-old daughter of Big Brown stalked early and drew off late in the 1-mile test to defeat five rivals.

A multiple stakes winner at 3, Kiss to Remember raced last

year for owner Maggi Moss and trainer Tom Amoss, who claimed her for \$50,000 in December 2013 at Fair Grounds. She was sold privately to her new connections following her start this past June at Canterbury Park.

The chestnut filly's next outing, her first start at Gulfstream Park and the first for Miller Racing and trainer Marty Wolfson, came in the Princess Rooney Stakes-G2 July 5, where she finished third. With her fifth win, and third in a stakes, from 18 starts, Kiss to Remember has earned \$418,371.

Kiss to Remember was bred in Maryland by Charles and Cynthia McGinnes and Big Brown Syndicate, and is the third stakes winner from

the stakes-winning Irish Open mare Taft Lil Queen, who is also the dam of El Viento, an El Corredor colt who took honors as champion imported 2-year-old colt in Puerto Rico, as well as co-champion Maryland-bred 2-year-old male, in 2005, and For Royalty, a \$250,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected yearling who was a stakes winner at 2 when capturing the Mountaineer Juvenile Fillies in 2009.

All eight of Taft Lil Queen's foals to start are winners, including stakes-placed \$203,805-earner The Prince. Her current 2-year-old, a Munnings colt named Pete's Play Call sold as a yearling at the Keeneland September sale for \$90,000 by the McGinnes, has yet to start.
