## Small breeder Reid finds Maryland Million success

**W**hat's it like to watch a horse you bred run in the Maryland Million?

Stressful, apparently.

"Your heart beats really hard," said Lisa Reid. "I was just thrilled that somebody thought highly enough of my little baby racehorse to run in a race like that."

Four-year-old filly Lionhearted Lady ran in and won the Distaff at Laurel Park Oct. 17 for owner Jody Smith and trainer Hammy Smith, but also delivered for Reid. The owner of Black Fox Farm in Union Bridge got her first stakes win as a breeder, from a free broodmare whose appeal

was originally as a potential producer of event horses.

Bred in Maryland by Fast Kitty Farms, Lucky Bridle sold for \$4,000 as a yearling but earned \$41,440 on the track with two wins for owner Linda Jane Atkins. The daughter of Unbridled Jet ran her last race in 2006 and when she

retired Atkins turned to Reid, who breeds sporthorses, takes layups, retrains Thoroughbreds for second careers and does sales-prep work.

"I produce event horses," Reid said, "and I thought she'd nick really well with my sporthorse stallion."

Then Lucky Bridle's half-brother Broadway Producer (by Not For Love) won the Maryland Million Turf and Jennings Handicap in 2008 at Laurel. As a winner herself and a half-sister to a stakes winner, Lucky Bridle had a chance to be more than the dam of future eventers. Reid called Laurie Calhoun at Summer Wind Farm for advice and Calhoun did some research.

"Well, it's something," Calhoun told Reid. "The mare [Lucky Sword] was a minor stakes winner and now she's produced a stakes performer."

Reid got excited, and—like most breeders in Maryland—said she'd love to send her mare to the state's leading sire Not For Love.

Then she realized she couldn't afford Not For Love, so opted for his son Love of Money. The foal, a colt later named Sam's Sonic, sold for \$5,000 to Jody Smith as a yearling in 2011. Reid chose Lion Hearted next, based on the success of his daughter Aspenglow, and got Lionhearted Lady. Smith spent \$7,500 for her as a yearling in 2012. Another Lion Hearted foal, this one a ridgling named Unbridled Lion, also joined the Smith stable as a private purchase.

All three foals are success stories. Sam's Sonic owns three wins and \$147,711 in earnings. Lionhearted Lady won her fourth race in the Dis-

taff, and pushed her earnings to \$168,693. Unbridled Lion broke his maiden at Pimlico in June.

Reid, who was in the winner's circle on Million Day, has gone along for the ride—and collected more than \$60,000 in breeder awards.

"It's been great," she said. "Jody keeps me updated and I get to experience it. I knew of Hammy but I didn't know them at all. It's been a lot of fun. My little freebie mare is doing some good things."

The Smiths are happy.

"We've bought three out of the same mare and they're all nice horses," said Hammy Smith. "My wife bought her, I didn't. She bought the first one and liked it, and went back and bought the next one and then the next one. She bought one over the phone, never even looked at it. [Reid]

has a real good broodmare there and she does a nice job with her horses. I'm real glad for it."

Reid studies pedigrees, works within her budget and supports local stallions.

Like all breeders, she's also weathered some pain. Lucky Bridle's Silver Train colt of 2013 had to be put down because of an injury and the mare aborted twins last year. She delivered a Cal Nation filly this year and is in foal to Bullsbay.

"She's an Unbridled Jet mare so I'm looking at something on the same lines as [2014 Maryland-bred juvenile filly champion] Miss Bullistic," Reid said. "I pay attention, read and study and try to get lucky. It shows you that even us little people can do it right and get lucky now and then."

## Bender mares sell at Fasig-Tipton's November select sale

The only two Maryland-bred mares offered at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale in Lexington, Ky., Nov. 1 sold, each for six figures. Both were campaigned by the late Howard Bender and consigned by Hunter Valley Farm, agent.

The first through the ring at Fasig-Tipton's marquee mixed sale was stakes winner More Than a Cruise, a 6-year-old daughter of More Than Ready and stakes winner River Cruise in foal for the first time to Bernardini. The third-generation homebred for Bender and his wife Sondra won or placed in 18 of 25 starts during a four-year career while earning \$260,854. Forging Oaks Farm made the \$330,000 purchase.

Also selling was Addison Run, a 5-year-old daughter of Unbridled's Song out of the Touch Gold mare Fleet and Fancy, the latter a half-sister to

champion Midshipman (by Unbridled's Song). The family includes 2015 Grade 1 winner Frosted and champion Salse.

Purchased as a yearling by the Benders for \$210,000 at Keeneland in 2011, Addison Run won or placed in five of her six starts and was stakes-placed in her final outing when third in the 2014 Geisha at Pimlico. In foal to Street Sense, the maiden mare was purchased for \$180,000 by Bloodstock Investments III.

"It was a good sale," said Glade Valley Farm manager Larry Murray, who trained both mares. "I thought anything over 250 would be great for More Than a Cruise, and anything over 150 for the other mare."

All of the Bender-owned broodmares, and the maiden mares recently off the track—22 in all—were in the process of being sold, with a handful going to Keeneland

## Maryland breeding numbers climb again

For the fourth year in a row, mares bred to Maryland stallions increased, with 788 reported bred in 2015, up 4.93 percent over the 2014 figure of 751 (a 16.1 percent increase over 2013). Reports for 36 Maryland stallions were submitted, for an average book size of 21.9.

Six Maryland stallions covered 50 or more mares: Seville (Ger), 94 (Heritage Stallions); Super Ninety Nine, 81 (Country Life Farm); Bandbox, 57 (Northview Stallion Station); Tritap, 57 (Heritage Stallions); Freedom Child, 52 (Country Life Farm); and Friesan Fire, 51 (Country Life Farm). The top four were standing their first seasons.

Based on forms received through Oct. 13, The Jockey Club reported that 1,449 stallions covered 34,627 mares in North America during 2015.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by mares reported bred, Kentucky, California, Ontario and Maryland stallions covered more mares in 2015 than in 2014, as reported at the same time last year.

## Auctions Anonymous

The surprisingly clear voice of the Keeneland auctioneer in Kentucky streams through the tiny speaker of a cell phone into the attic of this Maryland farmhouse. Every two minutes, the voice drops from an incomprehensible frantic chant to a calm declaration of a final price.

I scribble the last bid across the top of the thin catalogue paper, near the boldface Hip Number, in open space between brackets connecting Sire and Dam. Instead of writing out the zeroes, I slash a dash, so \$47,000 is just a hasty 47—; the way Dad marked up those old Timonium catalogues I found up here over the summer, his hand on the pages, performing that immutable ritual of the horse business—keeping score at an auction.

The old catalogues were bound in spiraling plastic rings that threaded through holes in the margins, with no identifying spine lines, and thus often lost to history even when in plain sight on shelves.

I found Dad's copy of the February 1966 dispersal of the William duPont mares. It was lying flat in one of his desk drawers, the drawers separated from the desk that was too wide to come up the narrow stairwell. But the catalogue was clearly intended to be safe-kept, a memento from the most historic auction in Maryland history, attended by the most famous breeders in the country, in the spanking new Fasig-Tipton pavilion in Timonium, in the early days of the Maryland-bred program, in the heady '60s upswing that lured Northern Dancer to Maryland.

I thumbed through the pages until I came to Hip 18, the 7-year-old mare All Beautiful, by Battlefield, by War Relic, by Man o' War, the mare Paul Mellon bought—Dad scribbled 175, his handwriting, a ghost in the attic looking to hop in my body. All Beautiful was just weeks away from delivering the foal who would become champion Arts and Letters, a commingling of the blood of Tesio's stallion \*Ribot and the broodmare influence of Man o' War, the mating planned by duPont.

In the elegant gray and yellow silks of Rokeby Stable, Arts and Letters won the 1969 Belmont Stakes. Mellon always made it clear that duPont's acumen produced the classic winner for Rokeby.

Three stories up over the front yard, my mind takes flight on the fickle role that luck plays in the history of horse auctions, while my cell drones with the cadence from Kentucky. I ask myself: What if American Pharoah had drawn one bid above the \$300,000 "Reserve Not Attained" at Saratoga in 2013? Would 310— have hammered him down to some French trainer, Baffert's classic touch untouched? What if champion mare Beholder had not come down with a fever that scratched her from the 2014 Fasig November sale, her 2015 Pacific Classic over males just a dream that didn't come true? And what if the greatest of all, Man o' War, had not been sold by his millionaire breeder, an honorary promotion to Major occupying his talents in Spain, rebuilding a world after The Great War? What if Maj.

Belmont had been at Saratoga the night Samuel Riddle bid \$5,000? Would he have protected his chestnut colt with a reserve, presaging American Pharoah's auction history?

On and on drones the auctioneer in the phone, as I wonder if my sons will someday stumble onto the current Keeneland catalogue in my hands, and say: This is the sale we got the Preakness winner in utero, the first Maryland-bred winner since Deputed Testamony.

You have to think like this to be in the horse business—one-part romantic, one-part realist, two-parts delusional—ghosts of luminaries in the attic, Dad's hand lifting off the page, touching my shoulder. I feel the mind of Maj. Belmont, a man of arts and letters, congratulating Riddle in a character-testing, bittersweet greeting. While on my desk rests *The Blood-Horse* cover, Pharoah's hindquarters all the Breeders' Cup field ever saw of him.

I fold down a few catalogue-page corners, looking for name sires, early cover dates, black-type, good old families. I pick up the cell phone and call Kentucky.

"Can you look at a few mares for us?" I ask.

You can feel the fates of history in this attic. Belmont, Riddle, Mellon. Man o' War, Arts and Letters, American Pharoah. I turn the light off at the bottom of the stairs, and on the air I swear I hear a spirited discussion.
