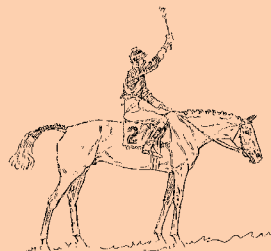

— NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT —

What we talk about when we talk about Pimlico

It's December. It's coming on Christmas. I am all alone at Pimlico, in the terraced second-floor Clubhouse Dining Room. The vast room is stripped bare, tables and chairs and compact TV's all removed. Three barren levels, each a hundred yards long; three runways of blue-dia-

mond wall-to-wall carpet, a hotel-hallway pattern from the 1970s. My first thought: It's a renovation in progress, prep-work for a freshening before the 2016 Pimlico Meet, set to start May 12, the Thursday after the Kentucky Derby, nine days before the Preakness Stakes.

A constant hum of white noise, an engine-room drone, falls from the ceiling vents. Outside through 15-foot-high plate-glass windows, a gray sky gathers rain clouds. I am searching for the soul of Pimlico, and I find it when I turn around and see eight large black-and-white photos, in

simple black trim, standing as silent witnesses to the history.

1. Clubhouse

The first photo is of the track bugler in action, blowing a trumpet as long as he is tall. Over his shoulders is the original clubhouse of the old track, a wedding-cake Victorian house topped with a cupola. The clubhouse wraps itself around the first turn of the track, immortalizing itself in the lexicon of the Turf: The clubhouse turn. This is the symbol of Old Hilltop. Fire carried it away in 1966. I ask myself: Why wouldn't every plan for Pimlico's future include a working replica of the Old Clubhouse?

2. The Clubhouse Turn

Weather-vane cupola of a horse and rider, high above a fleeing field of racehorses, their feet all four off the ground, leaning into the turn, riders beneath blowing manes.

3. Frenzy of a Full Field

Perspective: The inside rail. Subject matter: A dozen racehorses in quest of a classic. The old grandstand is the same as the present grand-

stand. Nothing has changed. Racehorses in blinkers and run-down bandages. Jockeys looking left and right for room to come over. You could animate this photo with sound and color and nothing would have changed, except the neighborhood, but no sirens break the spell.

4. Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons

In the winner's circle of the 1957 Preakness. The ancient horse trainer cups his right hand on the reins of Bold Ruler. Scoliosis bends him in two, but from under the brim of his fedora, his Irish eyes are smiling. His pants are pulled up to the middle of his chest, his white dress shirt barely visible. Bold Ruler rests his head in Sunny Jim's hands. Arcaro waves, the sleeves of his silks in relief against the clouds, while police in formal white caps lean over a Pimlico sign, that 1950s font: big P, tall I, really round o: Pimlico.

5. Secretariat

Blinkers prevent camera lenses from capturing the catch-light in the champion's eyes as he returns to be unsaddled. Turcotte peers

down into Big Red's bouncing mane. He must be thinking: This horse carried me from last-to-first on the clubhouse turn. If we'd lost, I'd have been toast.

6. Seabiscuit

Plain brown wrapper. Crooked left front, visible even just walking back to winner's circle after the famous Match Race of 1938, Triple Crown winner War Admiral vanquished. Binoculars swing from Mr. Howard's neck. Georgie "The Iceman" Woolf looks away from the camera, modest, keeping the focus on Seabiscuit, wide-set ears pricked, sweat waxing his brown neck.

I imagine turning up the ventilator system to a ridiculous level of white noise, just to give me a sense of the crowd that day.

7. Johnny Longden

The garland of Black-Eyed Susans reach the ground above the winner's hooves. Longden looks at you sternly. The owner (John D. Hertz) is a heavy-set man in a '40s fedora; his eyes are examining those

hooves. Why? Why is he looking down? Is he seeing if the horse grabbed himself, if he's bleeding at the coronet band?

A groom snapped two bandage pins into his belt loop. At the edge of the photo, a casual fellow has his hands on his hips. Every person in this photo is intent. No one smiles. They've just won the Preakness with Count Fleet, and no one is taking anything for granted.

8. Waiters

How many people have worked at Pimlico since it opened, way back then, in 1870? The ghosts of waiters in bowties pose on the carpet. Chairs elegant in black bent wood await patrons. The waiters put food on the tables in the photo to be able to put food on their tables at home. How many people have worked at Pimlico over the years? Eight waiters become 80, become 800, 8,000, 80,000, who knows? It's a ghost stat. It's still a stat, though, the many thousands who have worked at Pimlico.

This is what we talk about when we talk about Pimlico. 🍷



MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

Mayla latest stakes winner descending from Prospective Joy

Mayla graduated to stakes winner in her stakes debut when charging home in Delta Downs' \$75,000 Orleans Stakes for 3-year-old fillies Nov. 21. The daughter of Sharp Humor, bred by Country Life Farm and Fifteen Moons, took control straightening into the stretch in the 7-furlong test. She drew off to win by 4¾ lengths.

It was the 10th start of the year for the Bret Calhoun-trained Mayla, who finished third or better in her last six while amassing \$167,859 for owner Carl R. Moore Management and Brad Grady.

Mayla is a member of a family with strong ties to Country Life Farm in Bel Air. She is the second foal, and winner, for her dam Fifteen Moons, a daughter of former Country Life Farm stallion Malibu Moon also bred by a Country Life Farm partnership. Her second dam Prospective Joy is the stakes-winning daughter of Allen's Prospect bred by Fourbros Stable and most noted as the dam of Grade 1 winner Hookedonthefeelin,

who in turn produced three-time Grade 1 winner Pussycat Doll and Grade 1 winner Jimmy Creed, the latter a popular young sire in Kentucky whose first crop of 89 foals arrived this year. Another of Fifteen Moons' half-sisters, Citiview, is dam of two-time Grade 1 winner Midnight Lucky.

Mayla was sold as a weanling by her breeders for \$7,500 at the 2012 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale. Purchased by Carol Kaye and sent through the Midlantic May 2-year-old sale by Kaye and Naoise Agnew, Mayla was purchased by Joe Brocklebank for \$90,000.

Mayla is a half-sister to Moon Vision, a Pollard's Vision filly who won three times for Country Life Farm, including first time out as a 2-year-old in 2013, before being claimed at Monmouth Park last August.

Barren in 2013 and 2014, Fifteen Moons produced a filly by English Channel in 2015 and was bred back to Shakin It Up.



RESTING PLACE. Maryland-bred Cigar's grave at the Kentucky Horse Park received a finishing touch with the unveiling of a statue created by Kentucky artist Douwe Blumberg. The bronze depicts Cigar and Jerry Bailey in the stretch of the 1995 Breeders' Cup Classic. Bailey and trainer Bill Mott unveiled the finished version at a ceremony in October. Foaled at Country Life Farm in Bel Air, Cigar was Horse of the Year in 1995 and 1996 and earned \$9,999,815 (a record for a Maryland-bred and second all-time in North America). Retired to the Horse Park's Hall of Champions, he died in October 2014 at age 24.

Nancy Boyce books: Celebrating the work of our favorite cartoonist

For the first time the Maryland Horse Breeders Association is proud to offer a comprehensive collection of cartoons by Nancy Boyce. Her comic observations of all aspects of the horse business were published in the *Maryland Horse* for more than 30 years.

Boyce's work first appeared in the December 1953 issue and starred "Bill, the Stable Pony," who was modeled on her husband's lead pony at the track. Newly promoted *Maryland Horse* editor Raleigh Burroughs hired Boyce to add a bit of humor to the monthly publication and introduced her work to readers: "A creation of Nancy Boyce, these delightful sketches of the life and adventures of the equine 'character' will be a regular feature of the *Maryland Horse*."

Until the late 1980s her regularly featured cartoons, in addition to Bill the Stable Pony, included Confidentially Speaking, Hapless Hard-scramble and the always popular annual spread showcasing new stallions in Maryland.

The "Confidentially Speaking" series, published from 1963-86, is offered for sale as a set of three books. The price for the hardcover set is \$275 or \$100 for individual copies.
