MHBA elections: New board members, officers announced

Incumbents Becky Davis and David DiPietro, former MHBA president Jim Steele, and first-term members Louis Merryman and Sabrina Moore were elected to the 2016 board by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association membership. The results were announced at the MHBA's annual general membership meeting, at Merryland Farm in Hydes May 18.

Dictated by MHBA bylaws, the annual election fills five open seats on the board.

Rebecca Bowman Davis. A resident of Chestertown in Kent County, Davis has served three three-year terms on the board (2006-2011; 2013-2015). Owner of Goose Hill Farm since 2005 and a sales agent since 1986 (Becky Davis Agent Inc.), she also manages and operates Dance Forth Farm for her parents Tom and Chris Bowman.

An owner of 11 broodmares, Davis bred recent Maryland-bred champion Grateful Nation and has either bred, raised or sold numerous stakes performers, including Smart and Fancy, In C C's Honor, Love of Money and Not Abroad.

While being a member of the board she is "particularly interested in promoting Maryland-breds at auction and continuing the efforts to bring

together breeders, owners and horsemen as one cohesive group."

David DiPietro. A former president of Maryland Million Ltd., the Owings Mills (Baltimore County) resident, DiPietro serves his second term on the board.

A member of the Maryland Racing Commission's Breeding Industry Task Force, DiPietro was a co-founder of Maryland Stallion Station and has a diverse and extensive business background, including being a former senior executive of Deutsche Bank for more than a decade and former president of investment banking firm Signal Hill.

His small band of broodmares has produced two Maryland Million winners (Juke Joint and Jack On the Rocks). Among his goals are to "bring business experience and skills in addition to industry knowledge to address greatest challenges facing Maryland breeders and, in partnership with other board members, generate innovative ideas for revitalizing horse breeding in Maryland."

Louis Merryman. A member of a family with a long history of service to the MHBA—his father Edwin was on the board for the past three years—Merryman, 38, is a managing

partner in Heritage Stallions Inc. He recently syndicated Heritage's stallions Seville (Ger) and Imagining as well as aided in forming the partnership for Bourbon Courage.

Formerly the stallion manager and farm manager of Northview Stallion Station and general manager of Northview in Maryland and Pennsylvania, Merryman lives in Port Deposit (Cecil County). He notes that "In order for our Maryland Thoroughbred industry to progress and thrive it needs to be recognized and respected on a national level again by intro-

ducing our farms and horses to as many potential new fans and owners as we can."

Sabrina Moore. Manager of Greenmount Farm in Glyndon (Baltimore County), Moore, 23, has worked as a groom, in the Horsemen Relations department at Pimlico, and as a showman at the horse sales.

A committee member for the Maryland Horse Industry Board and the MHBA, she owns broodmares that include stakes-winners Mystic Love, Kosmo's Buddy and Littlebit-abling.

Among her goals as a board member are "to help

bring forth new members and to encourage and promote breeding and foaling mares in Maryland and to recruit a younger generation of horsemen to ensure the future of horse breeding in Maryland."

James B. Steele. The manager of Shamrock Farm in Woodbine (Carroll County) since 1977, Steele served on the board in the past and was MHBA president from 2006 through 2009 as well as secretary-treasurer in 1999. The current president of Maryland Million Ltd., he is also chairman of the Maryland Horse Industry Board and has previously served as chairman for the Maryland Farm Bureau Equine commission and Maryland and Carroll County Agricultural Commissions, and was vice-president of the Maryland Farm Bureau.

Runners bred by Steele include Maryland-bred champion Lord Kenneth and stakes winners My Sweet Lord, My Sweet Nenana and Toboggan Slide. His goals while on the board are "To promote and protect the horse industry in

Maryland. . . to continue to educate our legislators and the general public about the importance of the horse industry to Maryland's economy and way of life. . . and to work to maintain the strong connection that horse farms have with the agricultural community."

Of the five directors whose terms expired this year, Bill Reightler was ineligible to stand for reelection because of having served six consecutive years on the Board, and Edwin Merryman and Josh Pons chose not to run again. Those whose terms did not expire are Donald H. Barr, Richard F. Blue Jr., John W. Boniface, John C. Davison, Michael J. Harrison DVM, R. Larry Johnson, Kent Allen Murray, Lawrence E. Murray and Robert B. White.

At the June meeting, the new Board of Directors elected Robert B. "Willie" White as president and Michael J. Harrison as the new vice-president, and re-elected Richard F. Blue Jr. as Secretary/Treasurer.

Eclipse champion sprinter Smoke Glacken dead at 22

The brilliant Maryland-bred speedster Smoke Glacken, the Eclipse Award-winning sprinter of 1997, was euthanized due to the infirmities of old age April 22 at Gainesway in Kentucky, where he stood at stud his entire career after retiring from the track as a 3-year-old in 1997. The gray son of Two Punch, who had been pensioned since 2013, was 22.

Smoke Glacken won six times in eight starts, all stakes, in his brief but stellar championship campaign. His biggest score was a decisive frontrunning victory in the Frank J. De Francis Memorial Dash-G2 against older runners in what would be the final race of his career. A knee chip in his right fore was discovered soon after

and the decision was made to retire him.

A Grade 1 winner at 2—he dominated Saratoga's Hopeful Stakes by 9 lengths—and winner of four of his six juvenile starts (three stakes), Smoke Glacken earned the ti-

tle of Maryland-bred champion 2-year-old. He was initially put on the Triple Crown trail, but after finishing third in the Grade 3 Louisiana Derby at Fair Grounds and second in Keeneland's Lexington Stakes-G2, he raced exclusively at distances under a mile. The 1997 Maryland-bred Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old retired with 10 wins, two seconds and a third in 14 starts for earnings of \$759,560.

Bred by Perry Rosebrock and foaled at Glade Valley Farm in Frederick, Smoke Glacken was sold as a weanling by his breeder at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December mixed sale for \$14,700. He was back in the sales ring the following July at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky yearling sale, bringing \$34,000.

Trainer Henry Carroll purchased the colt out of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic May 2-year-old sale for \$65,000, and Smoke Glacken raced for

the partnership of Alex Karkenny, William Roberts and Robert Levy.

Out of the Magesterial mare Majesty's Crown, Smoke Glacken descended from the well-known Maryland family of Turn Capp (his third dam). He was a half-brother to multiple graded stakes winner Smokey Glacken and stakes winner Capote's Crown.

At stud Smoke Glacken sired 64 stakes winners, 16 graded, topped by Grade 1 winners On Fire Baby, Irish Smoke and Persistently, and millionaires Smok'n Frolic and Delaunay. His sons at stud include graded stakes winner and Grade 1 sire Read the Footnotes. As a broodmare sire, he has been represented by the Canadian champions Hunters Bay and Go Greeley.

Gainesway reported that Smoke Glacken was to be buried at the farm alongside former stallions In Reality, Coz-zene, Broad Brush and Mr. Greeley.

Ben's Cat: all-time stakes leader on the flat among Maryland-breds

With his victory in the Jim McKay Turf Sprint Stakes on Black-Eyed Susan Day at Pimlico, May 20, Ben's Cat surpassed Little Bold John by number of stakes wins on the flat, pushing his total to 26 in seven years of competition. Little Bold John, who retired in 1992, had 25.

Only one other Maryland-bred won as many as 20 stakes in a career on the flat, Hall of Famer Safely Kept, with 22. Next on the list is Twixt (18), followed by Challedon and Dave's Friend, who won 17 each.

Ben's Cat has won at least one stakes a year since he came to the races as a 4-year-old. Seven stakes he has won more than once, none more than the Mister Diz for Maryland-breds, which he has taken six times—every year since 2010.

National Hall of Fame steeplechase horse Elkridge holds the title of Maryland-bred leader by stakes wins when including jump competition, having won 27 in the 1940s and early 1950s.

Top-selling Md.-bred

Six Maryland-breds sell for six figures at FTM May 2-year-old sale

Of the 59 2-year-olds to sell for six-figures at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-Year-Olds In Training sale, six were bred in Maryland, representing 10 percent of the total, yet Maryland-breds made up 8 percent of the horses offered. The median for the Maryland-bred juveniles sold was \$40,000, 25 percent higher than the overall median of the sale, which was conducted Monday, May 23 and Tuesday, May 24 at the sales pavilion in Timonium.

Chuck Zacney went to \$210,000 to take home the sale's most expensive Maryland-bred, a filly from the first

crop of Stay Thirsty out of the Quiet American mare Buffgirl. Bred by Ellen Charles' Hillwood Stables, she is from the family of multimillionaire Prayer for Relief and Grade 1 winner Another Reef. Zacney told Jessica Martini of *Thoroughbred Daily News* that trainer John Servis picked out the filly, who worked a quarter-mile in :22 flat at the under tack show. Servis trains Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale graduate Cathryn Sophia for Zacney's Cash Is King Stable.

Consigned by Kirkwood Stables Agent VIII, the filly born May 3 was initially sold

by her breeder through the Dark Hollow Farm consignment at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale for \$75,000.

Hillwood Stables spent \$200,000 to buy a colt by Ice Box, who zipped a quarter in :21.60, the second-fastest time for the distance at the under tack shows. Out of Meadowlake's winning daughter Rey Lake, the colt foaled May 17 was bred by Avla Pitts and is a half-brother to stakes-winning juvenile Bessie's Boy. His second dam is stakes winner Expensive Issue. Consigned by Wavertree Stables Inc. (Ciaran Dunne) Agent, the colt sold twice as a yearling—at Keene-

land January and the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sales—on a bid of \$30,000 each time.

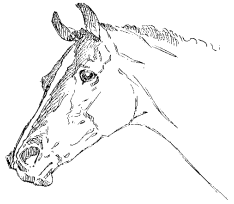

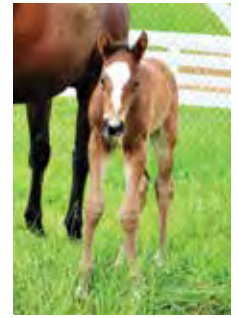
