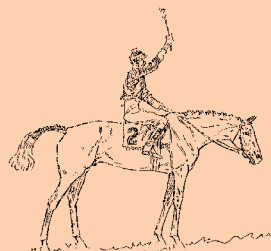

Sagamore filly rules 82nd annual yearling show

Though she probably just missed her barnmates from Sagamore Farm, the big bay filly made her case—loudly—that she belonged in the championship class of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association's yearling show June 26 at the Timonium Fairgrounds.

And her voice apparently carried as she took home the Chanceland Farm Challenge

Trophy as the show's champion. Judged by Mid-Atlantic trainer John Servis, the show attracted 115 yearlings and showcased some of the state's prime Thoroughbred crop born in 2015. Sagamore claimed its second championship in four years with the daughter of Into Mischief and the Not For Love mare Roadtohanna. The May foal won

Class IV, for fillies by out-of-state sires, and then repeated the performance in the championship showdown with the other three class winners a few moments later.

Physical makeup won the day, for Servis.

"There were nice sprinter-type horses in there, but that's not the kind of horse I like or look for," he said. "I like a big,

rangy, two-turn looking horse and that was her. She had a lot of the things that I like. She looked very athletic. She had a couple of little flaws that I felt as a horse trainer I could overlook, as nice as she was."

Sagamore's team celebrated the win, but paid full credit to their filly.

"We thought she was a really good one," said Sagamore's Debbie Moorefield. "She's big, but she has elegance. She has a really elegant walk and she reaches and steps and she's real sure of herself."

The Into Mischief filly—who whinnied through Moorefield's interview back in the barn—has a right to be, thanks to a deep family tree.

Bred in Maryland by Charlie and Cynthia Mc-

Guines, the champion's dam Roadtohanha never raced but has produced four winners—\$238,365-earner Going to Market and stakes performers Tell a Great Story, Give No Quarter and All I Karabout, for Sagamore. A 2014 colt by Scat Daddy placed in a class at the 2015 yearling show, and little sister went two steps better in 2016.

Sagamore founder Alfred Vanderbilt was a frequent yearling show participant and winner—taking championship honors seven times. Now owned by Kevin Plank, Sagamore won the championship with a Macho Uno filly in 2013.

"We're thrilled," said Moorefield. "It really matters. It's the prestige. It's like win-

ning a race at Pimlico. There's a lot of tradition here. Sagamore and Mr. Vanderbilt used to do the yearling show and we're sort of keeping it up. It means something."

Moorefield headed a crew from the historic farm at the show—Ihor Ihnatenko, Paco Vega, Francisco Lopez, Graham Bell, Randy Lewis, Jocelyn Brooks, Katelyn Lamp and Kaitlyn Helwig. Everybody pitched in with the six fillies in the day's final class.

"It's why we get up early in the morning and sweat on 100-degree days and groom these horses and bathe them and do everything that needs to be done," said Moorefield. "Otherwise, it's just work."

Reserve champion honors went to owner/breeder R. Larry Johnson's Maclean's Music colt. Smaller and more compact than the champion, the bay colt nevertheless caught the eye of Servis and others at the show.

"He had that athletic look to him," said Servis, who won this year's Kentucky Oaks with yearling show graduate Cathryn Sophia. "He wasn't a big horse, but he wasn't that horse that looks like he has to go 6 furlongs. He looks like a horse who has plenty of length to him and would probably stretch out with no problem. Just overall I thought he was very athletic looking."

Making his yearling show debut, Johnson brought a horse for each class and was happy to leave with a reserve championship, a class win, a chance to share in \$40,000 in bonus money for show graduates and plenty more. From the Two Punch mare Keeper Kell, the colt was foaled by the Bowman family in Maryland and prepped at home with Suzanne Dempsey.

"Wow, those are some nice horses in the ring," Johnson said after the class win. "I like my horse but I didn't come up here with any expectations. I bred him to race him and the incentive to this is the money that's available for them as racehorses. I don't sell too many of mine and I won't sell

show, which was founded in 1932. In addition to his Kentucky Oaks win with Cathryn Sophia, he won the 2004 Kentucky Derby and Preakness with Smarty Jones and trained Grade 1 winners Jostle and Round Pond on the way to more than 1,500 wins and \$46 million in purse earnings. The West Virginia native enjoyed the experience, but admitted it was not an easy job.

"I loved it," he said. "I really enjoy looking at young horses, especially horses who look good. I really enjoyed it. I had a good time. It was exhausting, I was pretty tired. A lot of that was standing out in the sun, but when you are looking at that many horses, it's mentally exhausting."

As usual, the judge did not know the pedigrees of the horses in each class until afterward—which really didn't make that much impact on his formula for finding the best horse.

"I always tell owners, especially new owners, that when I go to a sale, I get a catalog for two reasons—one for birthdates, and two to write my notes on. I couldn't care less about the pedigree . . . if he's a nice horse, they come from anywhere."

this guy. He looks like a racehorse."

Dempsey called the colt a tribute to his dam, a Johnson homebred who descends from the breeder's foundation mare Ran's Chick. Keeper Kell never raced but has produced three winners from four foals to race, including stakes-placed Change of Seasons.

"He's always been a nice colt," Dempsey said. "The dam is really nice, she's a classy horse, so easy to deal with, and he's been the same way. He's the one who kept all the other ones happy over here getting a bath today. He's the babysitter."

In the Maryland-sired classes, a Not For Love colt owned and bred by Dark Hollow Farm won Class I while a Hunters Bay filly owned and bred by Glenangus Farm won Class III. The colt is out of the Red Bullet mare Silver Ashlee, a half-sister to graded stakes winner Not for Silver and stakes winner Roman Chestnut. The filly, out of the stakes-placed El Corredor mare Lady of Summer, is a half-sister to two winners.

The MHBA presented a Young Showmanship Award for the first time, and the \$100 prize went to 14-year-old Katie Morgan of Chesapeake City for her work with her Orientate filly Whyyouask.

Servis is the latest on a long list of notable trainers, breeders, owners, bloodstock agents and other experts to judge the

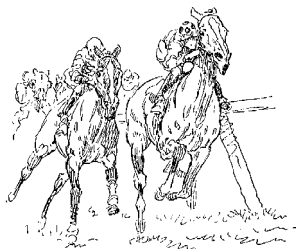

Millionaire rankings grow with addition of Cathryn Sophia

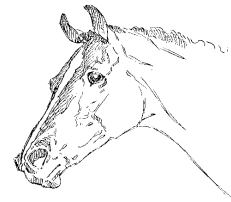
There are now 25 Maryland-bred millionaires as 3-year-old filly Cathryn Sophia surpassed the seven-figure mark with her third-place finish in the Grade 1 Acorn Stakes June 11 at Belmont Park.

In just her seventh career start—the fewest starts for any horse on the all-time Maryland-bred money winner list—the Street Boss filly bred by Robert T. Manfuso pushed her career earnings to \$1,019,720, good enough to rank 24th, just ahead of Urbane with \$1,018,568.

Owned by Cash is King LLC and trained by John Servis, Cathryn Sophia is

one of a handful of Maryland-breds ever to win a race worth \$1 million or more, accomplishing the feat with her victory in the Grade 1 Kentucky Oaks in May at Churchill Downs. The last million-dollar winner was Richard's Kid, in back-to-back runnings of the Pacific Classic (2009 and 2010).

Four-time Maryland-bred Horse of the Year Ben's Cat continues to increase his bankroll, having finished on the board in his first four starts this year at age 10. His total earnings of \$2,629,782 rank him fifth all time, just \$27,011 shy of fourth-leading earner Broad Brush.

MARYLAND-BRED STAKES WINNERS

Giant Run rebounds with stakes score at Belmont Park

A stakes winner in March at Gulfstream Park, Giant Run notched his second stakes win with a determined run in the \$100,000 Manila Stakes for 3-year-olds at Belmont Park on the July 4th holiday. The Maryland-bred son of Giant's Causeway, who hasn't been worse than third in six starts this year, was allowed to go off the 7-1 fifth choice in the field of seven, but turned in his patented run by being on or near the lead early and making his move in the stretch. He gained

control swinging into the stretch and opened up at the wire to win by a length and a half. His final time for the mile on firm turf was a solid 1:32.85.

Winner of the Cutler Bay Stakes earlier this year, the chestnut colt owned by Robert Baker and William Mack and trained by Tom Albertrani was also second in two other Gulfstream Park stakes, the Grade 3 Palm Beach in his stakes debut, and English Channel Stakes in May. On June 4, he shipped to Penn National and

finished third in the \$500,000 Penn Mile Stakes-G3. From 10 starts, he has three wins and four placings, all on the turf, for earnings of \$247,560.

Purchased by his owners for \$200,000 at the 2014 Keeneland September Yearling Sale, the colt was bred by Richard Golden's Sycamore Hall Thoroughbreds. He is the third stakes performer for his dam, the Polish Numbers mare Who Did It and Run, an accomplished turf runner with wins in the Grade 2 Jersey Derby (against males), and the

Reeve Schley Jr. Stakes-G3. She is also the dam of stakes winner American Victory, dam of 2016 stakes-placed 3-year-old Charmed Victory, and Who's Cozy, a graded stakes-placed runner and dam of stakes winner Who's in Town and stakes-placed Campaign Vows.

Who Did It and Run produced a daughter of Not For Love, named Worthy of Love, in 2014, and a full brother to Giant Run in 2015. She was bred to Magician (Ire) for this year.
