Economic study shows rebirth of Maryland horse industry

An economic impact study of the Maryland horse industry released in November showed that Maryland horse farming brings in more than \$1.15 billion in economic activity a year, 23 percent higher than the \$930 million it generated in 2010.

The survey findings were announced at a news conference at Goucher College in Towson. Speaking at the announcement were Anirban Basu, chairman and CEO of Sage Policy Group, Joe Bartenfelder, secretary of the Maryland Department of Agriculture, and Dr. José Antonio Bowen, president of Goucher College.

Also announced was the relocation of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association headquarters from Timonium to Goucher College. Goucher is the home of one of the nation's premier collegiate equestrian programs and is in the process of building a new equestrian facility on its 287-acre campus.

Top survey findings by the Sage Policy Group show that the Maryland horse industry supports approximately 5,800 full-time jobs across Maryland (9,100 by including indirect

FTE positions), with nearly a half-billion dollars in wage and salary income.

Spending in the horse industry exceeded \$660 million in 2015.

The survey estimates that if the current pace of industry expansion continues through 2020, the industry will have a \$1.5 billion yearly economic impact on Maryland and would support more than 11,000 jobs with \$620 million in employee income.

The findings do not include the impact of racetrack operations, including the Preakness. The Preakness alone generates more than \$30 million in statewide economic impact each year.

The Sage Policy Group's findings are significant. After years of decline, Maryland's horse industry, which is interconnected and involves more than racing, is on the upswing.

While spending on equipment, personnel and physical structures is on the rise, according to the report it would grow even more quickly if there was less uncertainty about the State's commitment to the current slots funding formula. Currently, 7 percent of slot machine revenues at

Maryland casinos are directed to the Purse Dedication Account and the Racetrack Facilities Renewal Account at Maryland horse racing tracks.

"Several years ago, Maryland's voters and elective representatives decided to allow the state's horse farming industry to compete on a more level playing field. The result has been a thriving horse farming industry. Back then, the industry's in-state economic impact had dipped below \$1 billion and was rapidly in decline," said Basu of the Sage Policy Group. "Today, impact easily exceeds \$1 billion, and Maryland's industry is regaining lost regional market share. This is translating into more jobs, higher incomes, better entertainment, long-delayed physical upgrades, elevated tax collections and millions of dollars' worth of preserved open space."

The study was sponsored by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association and 13 other industry partners representing all aspects of the state's equine industry: Cloverleaf Standardbred Owner's Association, Fasig-Tipton Midlantic, Maryland Association for Wildlife Conservation, Mary-

land Horse Council, Maryland Horse Industry Board, Maryland Jockey Club, Maryland Million Ltd., Maryland Standardbred Breeders Association, Maryland State Fair, Maryland Steeplechase Association, Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Ocean Downs Racetrack and Rosecroft Raceway.

"Horses are a critical component to Maryland's agricultural industry. The continued success of Maryland's horse industry is an important part of growing our economy and creating jobs for more Marylanders, and it's helping to preserve our farmland and open spaces as well," said Gov. Larry Hogan.

"I'm so pleased to see Maryland's horse industry make such a comeback after some challenging years. The horse industry is a major contributor to Maryland's agriculture economy through hay and bedding suppliers, feed stores and grain growers, and a multitude of small businesses that

service the industry," said Secretary Bartenfelder.

The Sage Policy Group sent surveys to more than 1,000 stakeholders to collect hard, operational statistics to drive the analysis. Nearly 700 surveys were completed by stakeholders from every county in Maryland. ❧

The President's Corner

What do the results of the recent economic survey say about the Maryland horse industry and how can the MHBA use those results?

"The economic study provides a clear indication that the partnership between the state of Maryland and the Thoroughbred industry is beginning to produce measurable results and mutual benefits.

The breeding industry is rebounding and had the largest percentage increase in mares bred in 2015 of any state. The recent yearling sale had very positive results with a Maryland-bred colt topping the sale at \$450,000.

The confidence within our industry that it is on track to survive and prosper has energized the track owners to invest hundreds of millions of dollars in the facilities at Laurel and is further evidence of the resurgence of the entire industry.

As we continue to work our way back, you can see the fences being repaired, new roofs on barns, asphalt being repaired and essentially the farms being saved from development. There is a new sense of pride in and commitment to continuing the legacy of Thoroughbreds in our state and the MHBA is pleased to be a part of the effort to save this important Maryland tradition and the positive economic contribution it makes to our state." ❧

Maryland Fund Stallion Registration Application

Registration fee \$250 per year

(Covers one year—January 1 through December 31 inclusive)

Stallion bonuses are generated by registered Maryland-bred offspring every time they finish in the top three in races in the state. However, no bonus will be paid unless stallion is properly registered as a Maryland stallion each year with the MHBA. The registration fee is \$250 and must be renewed annually. Registration should be made when stallion's first foals reach racing age.

Although registration may be made at any time, no bonus will be paid on any race unless the stallion was registered prior to the running of said race. Registration is effective when fee is received, not when post marked.

If the stallion died, retired from active duty, or left the state after July 15, 2004, he should be kept eligible for stallion bonuses by payment of the proper fee until those foals that were conceived in Maryland cease to race.

09.10.01.49 Rewards to Breeders — Maryland-Bred Rules

A. For the purposes of this regulation:

(3) A Maryland stallion is a stallion that is:

- (a) In Maryland for at least one full breeding season, which begins on February 15 and ends after July 15 of each year; or
- (b) Brought into Maryland subsequent to the start of the breeding season and approved as a Maryland stallion by the Registration Committee of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association;

(4) The owner of Maryland stallion qualifies for a stallion owner award if:

- (a) The person was the owner at the time that a registered Maryland-bred sired by the stallion was conceived and the conception occurred during the Maryland breeding season as described in §A(3)(a) of this regulation; and
- (b) The stallion is registered annually with the Maryland Horse Breeders Association.

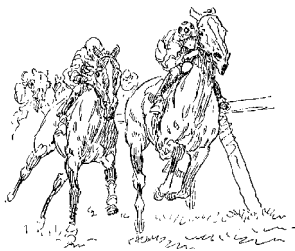
