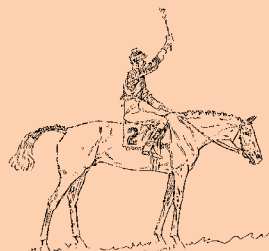

Good Night Shirt, Deputed Testamony join Maryland-bred Hall of Fame

Deputed Testamony and Good Night Shirt—two of the oddest named champions in racing history—are the 2017 inductees to the Maryland-bred Thoroughbred Hall of Fame.

Classic winner Deputed Testamony became a hometown hero when he captured the 1983 Preakness Stakes (and remains the last Maryland-bred to do so). The bay colt was Maryland through and through—bred by the Boniface family of Harford County, who co-owned him with Boston, Mass., businessman Francis P. Sears in the name of their Bonita Farm; by a stallion (Traffic Cop) who stood at Bonita; and trained at the farm by J. William (Billy) Boniface. Deputed Testamony was ridden to victory in the Preakness by Marylander Donnie Miller, who picked up the mount when Herb McCauley elected to stay with stablemate Parfaitement.

Deputed Testamony's ground-saving trip and stretch run over the sloppy Pimlico surface caused mass celebration, including in the track's press box, where the trainer's father, the senior Bill Boniface, worked for decades as a racing editor for the Baltimore *Sun*. Less than a month later more than 400 racing fans, including Gov. Harry Hughes, turned



out at Pimlico to pay tribute to the colt known as D.T. ABC Sports broadcaster Jim McKay was host of the event, and the

governor declared it Deputed Testamony Day.

How did the odd spelling of the Deputed Testamony's

name occur? Billy Boniface looked at the names of the colt's sire and dam and asked his neighbor, John Clark, a lawyer and judge in Bel Air, to give him a legal term that would put the two names together. "Deputed is a legal word, you can look it up in the dictionary," said Boniface. "Testimony I just spelt wrong."

Deputed Testamony raced three seasons, from 2 to 4, and won seven stakes, with additional graded wins during his sophomore year in the Grade 1 Haskell Invitational at Monmouth and Bowie's Grade 3 Governor's Cup Handicap. A member of one of the most accomplished Maryland-bred classes in history, he was named champion 3-year-old

over fellow classic winners Caveat (Belmont Stakes) and Shareef Dancer (Irish Derby).

At 2, Deputed Testamony set a 1-mile track record at Meadowlands in the Play the Palace Stakes, his first stakes victory. In his prior start, he just missed by a nose when second to Dixieland Band in the inaugural Maryland Juvenile Championship, with Caveat third.

Deputed Testamony holds the track record at Pimlico for $1\frac{1}{16}$ miles (1:40.80) which he set in his final start, the 1984 City of Baltimore Handicap on the Preakness card. He exited the race with a fractured coffin bone in his right fore, which forced his retirement after 20 starts, of which he won 11 times and earned \$674,329. He

entered stud at Bonita, proved a solid sire, and lived out his life at the larger property in Darlington, built because of his success. He was racing's oldest classic winner when he died at age 32 Sept. 18, 2012.

Good Night Shirt was bred to run on the flat, but excelled over jumps. A two-time Eclipse Award winner, he was only the third American steeplechaser to surpass \$1 million in career earnings, and was the first steeplechaser to be named Maryland-bred Horse of the Year (2008). He also earned four consecutive state-bred steeplechase championships (2006-09). In March it was announced that he will enter the 2017 National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame as a steeplechase electee.

Bred by Dr. and Mrs. Tom Bowman, the chestnut son of Breeders' Cup Classic-G1 winner and Maryland-bred Hall of Famer Concern and the Two Punch mare Hot Story was owned for the majority of his career by Harold A. "Sonny" Via Jr. and trained by Jack Fisher. Named after a saying by Tom Bowman's grandmother, Good Night Shirt was sold as an unraced 3-year-old in 2004, made eight starts on the flat that year (winning twice at Pimlico) and then was sold again as a steeplechase prospect to Via.

With Fisher training (2005-09), Good Night Shirt recorded 10 graded stakes wins, including eight Grade 1s, and earned \$1,007,803 of his career total \$1,041,083. From summer 2006 to spring 2009, he made 14 consecutive graded starts and won 10—including a streak of seven in a row. Racing at the top level, he recorded back-to-back wins in the Marion du Pont Scott Colonial Cup-G1, Lonesome Glory-G1 and Iroquois-G1. He made two starts at 8 in spring 2009—winning the Grade 2 Carolina Cup and finishing second in the Iroquois—and was set to return that fall when sidelined by a fractured left front cannon bone, which eventually forced his retirement. A winner of 14 of 33 lifetime starts, he retired to Fisher's farm in Monkton, where he resides.

Maryland Thoroughbred Hall of Fame inductees are selected by a committee of racing industry members. Candidates must be retired from racing at least five years to be eligible.

Under the collaboration of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association and Maryland Racing Media Association, the Hall of Fame was initiated in 2013 and now numbers 20 members. The class of 2017 joins Awad, Broad Brush, Challedon, Cigar, Concern, Dave's Friend, Find, Gallorlette, Jameela, Kauai King, Little Bold John, Politely, Safely Kept, Twixt and Vertex and steeplechasers Elkridge, Jay Trump and Tuscalee.

Tom Michaels and his wife Lorna Baker have a 15-acre farm on the Eastern Shore in Denton. "I'll breed two mares, then I like to skip a year to work on [the babies], getting them broke," said Michaels. "I don't breed them every year, but now I probably will breed her every year." He was referring to Truthful Dutch, the dam of two of the best horses Michaels has bred in nearly 30 years in the business. Truthful Dutch's son Laki became her first stakes winner in the \$75,000 Not For Love Stakes at Laurel Park March 18.

The 4-year-old chestnut gelding, trained by Damon

Dilodovico for Hillside Equestrian Meadows, was the least experienced of the race's seven entrants, making just his fifth start. But he was coming in off three consecutive wins and was the lukewarm favorite over Stolen Love (a son of Not For Love). Laki took charge of the 6-furlong stakes at the top of the stretch and held off Sonny Inspired in 1:09.56, the second fastest time at the distance at Laurel this year.

Laki means "lucky" in Hawaiian, Michaels said.

"My wife was born in Hawaii and she has all these Hawaiian names," said Michaels, who sold Laki as a yearling "before he was really a year old." A June foal, Laki "was built like a little racehorse when he was born" said his breeder, but didn't make his first start until last November.

"Mentally, he's just kind of coming together," Dilodovico said. "He always showed spurts here and there but not consistently, but since the turf race [his debut in which he was last of 10] he's kind of put it together."

A son of the Not For Love son Cuba, Laki had the dis-


inction of being Cuba's first winner when he broke his maiden Dec. 24 at Laurel over a sloppy track, and is now the stallion's first stakes winner. Cuba stands at Royal Wux Farm in Chestertown, about 30 miles north of Denton. Leased out for this year, Truthful Dutch was due to foal in April to another Royal Wux Farm stallion, Gandhi. Michaels plans to breed her back to Cuba.

Michaels breaks and trains his own horses on his farm he named Dusty Acres, which includes a three-eighths of a mile training track he put in

himself when he purchased the property approximately 20 years ago. He has five horses in training, including, Laki's 2-year-old full-sister Maui Wahine. Described as "probably the best horse I've ever bred" the filly has been working with older horses on the farm and by mid-April was ready for her first breeze. "I've waited many years to get a really good stakes horse, and this might be the one," he said. "She looks like a 4-year-old right now. She's built like that. She's by far the best horse I've ever had."

2017: 1st \$75,000 **Conniver S**, 7 fur., registered Md.-bred or sired fillies and mares, 4 & up, Laurel, March 18.

Making her stakes debut in her 55th start, MCA Racing Stable's Next Best Thing split horses leaving the backstretch, opened a clear lead down the lane and held off late-running If I Was a Boy to win the \$75,000 Conniver by a length. The 7-year-old daughter of Stephen Got Even recorded her 13th victory,

and boosted her earnings to \$376,802. Three of her wins, and \$104,402, have come from five starts this year.

It was also the first stakes victory for jockey Katie Davis, who guided the mare to victory in an optional-claimer for the meet's leading trainer Claudio Gonzalez March 4.

Next Best Thing rated off the pace of One Proud Gal, who ran the first quarter-mile in :24.34. Davis sent her mare to the front after a half-mile in :47.86, opened up in the stretch and had enough left to hold off a driving If I Was a Boy. Favorite Bawlmer Hon was another 3½ lengths back in third in the field of five Maryland-bred fillies and mares. Next Best Thing completed 7 furlongs in 1:24.40. "When I saw the opening I had to go or I knew I would be right up on them," said Davis.

"I made the decision to scoot between them and she went right on by."

Next Best Thing has been a popular campaigner throughout her career. Bred by Charles and Cynthia McGinnes and foaled at their Thornmar Farm in Chester-town, she was sold by her breeders for \$13,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic fall sale in 2011. In her only start at 2, she finished third at 40-1. Her first win came in her next start, for a \$25,000 tag at Parx Racing. Competing mostly in starter allowances and claimers, she passed through a number of

barns, including that of Mary Eppler, who haltered her for \$5,000 at Parx in July 2014.

Gonzalez took her from Eppler for \$5,000 in December 2015 at Laurel. In her last 10 starts she has been risked for a tag five times, the lowest being \$16,000 in her first start of the year at Parx Jan. 17.

Next Best Thing comes from a long line of durable runners. Out of the El Gran Senor mare Mexicali Rose, she is a year-younger half-sister to Rose Brier, a son of Mizzen Mast who has won five stakes—including the Bert Allen three times—and is five times stakes-placed. He set a

course record (a turf mile in 1:33.11) at Laurel in last year's Henry Clark Stakes and has placed in two Grade 3 stakes.

Still in competition, he has earned \$502,266 with a record of 37-14-10-6 over six seasons.

All six of Mexicali Rose's foals to start are winners, and five have earned six-figures. The mare's first foal to get to the races, Cow Town Kid, competed 10 years, won 16 of 85 starts and earned \$237,722. Next came Bean, who started 82 times over eight years, winning 13 and earning \$158,519. Baileys Beach made \$177,515 from 30 starts in four years.

The McGinneses purchased Mexicali Rose for \$2,700 from Bill Backer's Smit-ten Farm consignment at the 2009 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December sale while carrying Next Best Thing. The couple bred one more foal out of the mare, a 2012 colt named Pred-atory (by Desert Party) who sold as a yearling for \$57,000 at Keeneland September. He never started.

Backer purchased Mexicali Rose as a weanling for \$65,000 at Keeneland November in 1995. She won once in 13 starts, her debut at 2 at Timonium in 1997.

Maryland-breds among highlights at OBS 2-year-old sale

4 **F**our Maryland-bred juveniles were offered at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's March 2-year-old sale, March 14 and 15 in Ocala, Fla., and all brought six figures, for an average of \$483,750. The overall sale average was \$186,727. The quartet combined to sell for \$1,935,000.

The most expensive at \$950,000 was a bay colt by Union Rags out of stakes winner Alexandra Rylee (by Afleet Alex). Bred by Stuart Grant's The Elkstone Group, the colt was a home run pinhook for agent Bobby Dobb, who purchased the colt for client Grand Oaks at the Keeneland September Yearling sale for \$135,000. Dennis O'Neill signed the ticket at Ocala for new owner Amr Zedan.

A bay filly by Scat Daddy out of the Elusive Quality mare Broad Quality sold for \$525,000 to Lane's End Bloodstock from the Crupi's New Castle Farm consignment.

Bred by Caroline Stautberg in the name of Willow Oaks Stable, the filly sold as a yearling for \$150,000 at Saratoga. Her second dam, Broad Queen (by Broad Brush) was a full- or half-sister to stakes winners Brushing Gloom and Clash by

Night, and produced stakes winners Queen Greeley and Blushing Dixie.

Sagamore Farm bred the son of Quality Road—Polyester, by Tiz Wonderful, purchased by Jay Em Ess Stable for \$340,000. Starting Point Thoroughbreds was the agent for the bay colt initially sold at the Keeneland September yearling sale for \$200,000. His unraced dam is a half-sister to stakes winners Sneaky Quiet and Ironman Dehere.

EQB Inc. spent \$120,000 for a Data Link colt on behalf of Zayat Stables. Bred by Barak Farm out of the winning Arch mare Arch Enemy, the colt has been through the auction ring three times—he sold for \$21,000 as a weanling at Keeneland November, and \$65,000 at Keeneland September. His dam has five winners from five starters, and is a half-sister to graded stakes winner Tenacious Tiffany.

Two juveniles out of Maryland-bred/Maryland-sired mares sold for more than a half-million at the sale. A Curlin colt, out of the Lion Hearted mare Storm Hearted, brought a final bid of \$950,000 from Rattler Racing. The Kentucky-

bred chestnut is a half-brother stakes winner Wake Up Nick.

Storm Hearted, now 15, is from the first crop of the late Northview Stallion Station sire Lion Hearted. Bred by Northview Stallion Station, she sold at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed sale as a weanling for \$12,000, then was a \$65,000 RNA as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky sale. She went back through the ring at Barretts' sale the next March, and was knocked down for \$240,000 by CRK Stables, who bred the Curlin colt. In nine starts she managed three placings and earned \$28,800.

An Animal Kingdom colt out of Maryland Million Ladies winner Miss Lombardi (by Unbridled Jet) sold for \$550,000 to Solis/Litt. Bred by Graham Motion's Herringswell Stables, the bay Ken-

tucky-bred is the most expensive 2-year-old from the first crop of the Kentucky Derby-G1 and Dubai World Cup-G1 winner to sell at public auction. Miss Lombardi is also the dam of 2014 Maryland-bred champion 2-year-old filly Miss Bullistic.

Another pinhooking coup was a colt by Jimmy Creed out of the five-time stakes-winning Maryland-bred Shiny Sheet (by Press Card). The Kentucky-bred was sold as a short yearling at Keeneland January in 2016 for \$15,000 to Thoroughbred Champions Training Center, who sent him through the ring at Ocala and got \$320,000 as Dennis O'Neill signed the ticket.

Shiny Sheet, now 19, had a long career in the region, earning \$543,432. The colt from the first crop of Jimmy Creed is her eighth foal.
