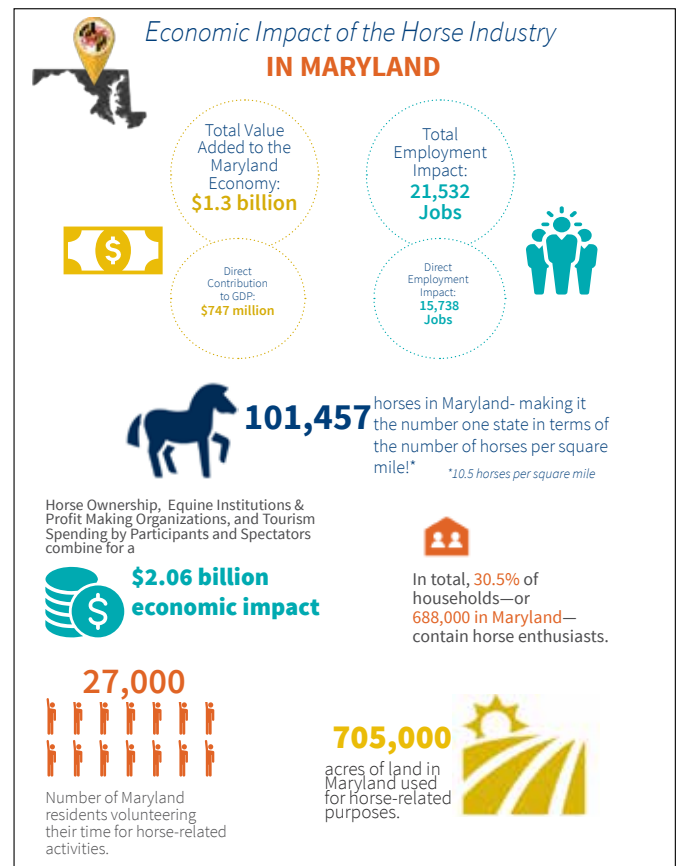
Maryland horse industry adds \$1.3 billion to state economy

The 2018 Economic Impact Study produced by the American Horse Council confirms that Maryland's horse industry adds more than \$1.3 billion to Maryland's economy. The report found that the horse industry total employment impact is more than 21,000 jobs, including a more than \$500 million impact from the horse racing sector alone.

The report quantified the economic benefits generated from three of the main sectors of the horse industry; recreation, competition and racing. It also enumerated the additional benefits the horse industry offers to the State of Maryland including land preservation, volunteerism, equine therapy and rehoming operations and educational opportunities at academic institutions.

"Horses are a part of Maryland's history and heritage, but this study confirms the important contributions that industry makes today to Maryland's economy and way of life. As a part of the agriculture community horse farms are productive partners in protecting the environment and educating young people," said Cricket Goodall, executive director of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association.

Maryland is a significant horse racing hub in the United



States, emphasized every May by the Preakness Stakes and Jim McKay Maryland Million Day in October, but Maryland's racing industry continues to thrive throughout the year.

Between five racetracks and more than 260 live racing

days, the industry adds \$365 million in value to the state's economy and supports 5,214 jobs resulting in a \$572 million economic impact.

"Maryland's racing industry has continued to grow and make major strides at our facilities. The support from specta-

tors and horsemen throughout the country has allowed us to continue to grow and excel," said Sal Sinatra, president and general manager of the Maryland Jockey Club.

With more than 101,000 horses Maryland boasts more horses—10.5 horses per square mile—than any other state in the nation. The quantity of horses and variety of activities ensure the recreation and competition sectors have significant impact. The horse industry also plays a significant role in protecting the environment and keeping Maryland green with 25 percent of Maryland's agriculture land, around 750,000 acres, used for horse-related purposes.

"The study confirms the depth and breadth of the equine industry. We have 35 equestrian disciplines and 40 breeds of horses with horse shows, rodeos and thousands of folks, particularly youngsters, taking riding lessons

and learning about and enjoying horses. Both the racing and non-racing sectors complement each other in a very strong and productive way," said Ross Peddicord, executive director of the Maryland Horse Industry Board

The recreation and competition sectors combine for a \$396 million in added value to Maryland's economy and support more than 8,000 jobs, resulting in a \$652 million economic impact.

There are also at least 36 therapy operation facilities, 13 rescue and rehoming operations, and more than 300 equine associations and several academic institutions that educate, promote and contribute to Maryland's economy.



Maryland Thoroughbred Career Program participants chosen

The Maryland Thoroughbred Career Program, an educational program presented by the the Maryland Horse Industry Foundation, will have six participants for its second year. Selected for the program that will run from June 4-9 are Lauren Carter (University of Maryland), Brianna Higgs (Centenary University), Camille Lee (University of Maryland), Amber Roher (University of Kentucky), Farrah Staebell (Colorado State University) and Kandace Tignor (University of Findlay).

"Once again, we were impressed by the quality of applicants and we are thrilled that this passionate group of six has come on board," said MTCP coordinator Jordyn Egan. "When this program was launched in 2017 each person or facility we visited welcomed us with open arms.

There is a lot of support for young people coming up in the Maryland Thoroughbred industry and graduates of this program will have a head start on further educational opportunities and jobs."

Willie White, MHBA president, said, "I find the people throughout the Thoroughbred industry to be some of the most passionate individuals I know. Young people often struggle to find a way to carry that passion on in finding a career path. The MTCP provides its participants with exposure and experiences that can give them real direction in determining how they can continue with their love of horses while developing that meaningful career. We are very proud of the program's success as the result of Jordyn's efforts and total commitment to the participants. I look forward to meeting this year's group

and learning more about their plans for the future."

When the participants meet in June, they will have access to leaders of the Maryland Thoroughbred industry during site visits that explore everything from breeding

MHBA April Seminar



The first of a series of free seminars, geared to educate newcomers in all facets of the Thoroughbred industry, was conducted by the Maryland Horse Breeders Association and The Racing Biz April 21 at Sabrina Moore's farm in Glyndon. A panel, including Moore, Mike Pons and George Adams, discussed and answered questions about breeding Thoroughbreds. Participants were invited to join a tailgate at the Grand National Races afterwards.

MD-bred filly wins state's first 2YO race

Jellicoe Creek's 2-year-old homebred filly Gallanor overcame a slow start and finished fast to spring a 15-1 upset in Maryland's first juvenile race of 2018, a 4½-furlong maiden special weight April 29 at Laurel Park. Trained by Phil Schoenthal and ridden by Carlos Quinones, she got her head down on the wire to win over favorite No Refunds, with Margie Is Livid third in a blanket finish.

Gallanor, a daughter of Maryland sire Redeemed, was making her first official start, but had gained experience from a victory at the Aiken Trials in South Carolina in March.

"She was pretty professional today," said Schoenthal. "She had a race under her belt

when she won the Aiken Trials so we felt like coming in with the edge of experience that she was really going to run well."

"It's nice to breed one as well as own one," said Ron Madden. "I've had a few racehorses over the years, but it's nice to also breed them."

The filly is eligible for the Maryland Million in October, and Schoenthal has it circled on his calendar.

"Finding a race will be the hardest thing," he said about her next start. "We'll just get her back to the barn and see how she comes out of it and make a plan from there. Certainly the Maryland Million has got to be the year-end goal, for sure. That's a long way away." 🐾

IN MEMORIAM

Margie Fisher MacNeille

Margie Fisher MacNeille died March 15. She was the oldest daughter of Janon Fisher Jr., one of the founding members of the Maryland Horse Breeders Association. She graduated from Garrison Forest School in 1942 and Katherine Gibbs Secretarial school in New York City and played the piano. She rode at a young age helping to break yearlings, galloping her father's racehorses at Pimlico (during World War II, she was one of the first women to do this). She made hunters and loved to fox hunt, knowing the country at Elkridge-Harford and her home country with the Green Spring Valley Hounds. Margie never forgot a horse or their pedigree, contributed a number of pedigree columns to *The Maryland Horse* magazine and was very helpful to her father with the Maryland Bloodstock Agency.

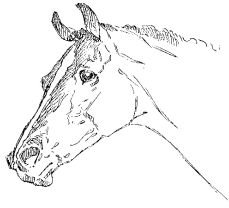
As a graduation present, she was given a mare named Swing Music, who became the dam of stakes winner Shivaree and 10 other winners, plus was the granddam of one of her favorite hunters, Sun Dog, who retired from racing after winning two American Grand Nationals over brush at Belmont Park.

Margie lived at "King's Eye" for 68 years and was married to Merrall MacNeille. Together they had a flock of sheep and raised lamb to sell. For many years Merrall was the chief steward at the Maryland tracks and Delaware Park.

Margie is survived by her children Margie MacNeille of Anchorage, Alaska, Ann MacNeille of Catonsville and Merrall MacNeille Jr. of Dunedeen, New Zealand; also two step-daughters, Ellen Charles of Chevy Chase and Melissa Cantacuzene of Aldie, Va.; brother Janon Fisher III, sisters Amelia Fisher, Julie Colhoun, Eugenia Elder and Ann Este Stifle. 🐾

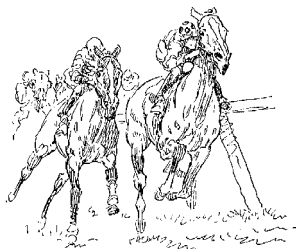
